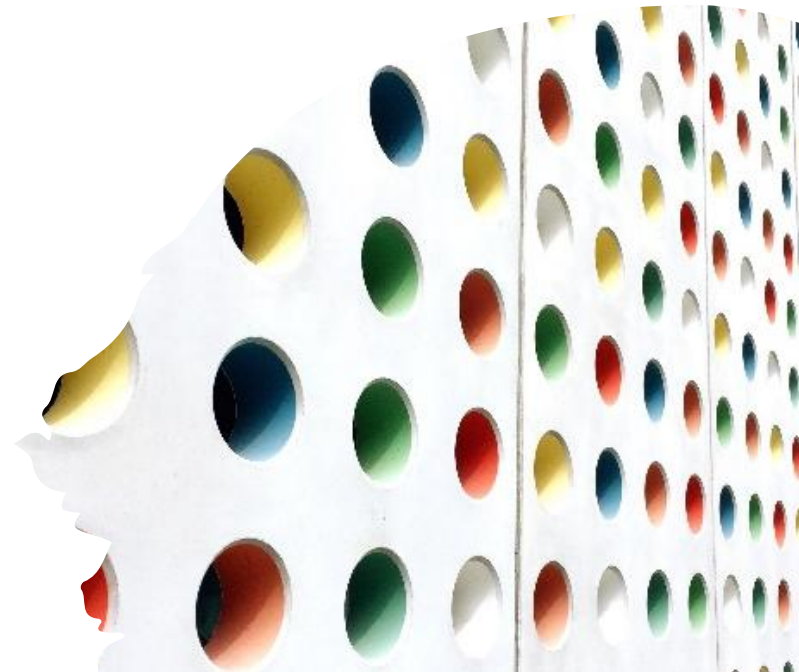


Longitudinal National Telephone Tracking Poll-Baseline

27th July 2026



Summary of Findings

- A special poll by Global InfoAnalytics shows overwhelming support for the president's decision not to seek for a third term. The poll shows 65% of voters agree with President Mahama's decision while 27% disagree with him and 8% did not have an opinion.
- However, when voters were asked if agree with those calling for President Mahama to go for a third term, the poll shows a divided nation with just, 50% disagreeing to call while 40% agreed and 10% did not have an opinion.
- On the direction of the country, 60% of voters say the country is headed in the right direction, 28% said wrong direction while 12% did not have an opinion. However, 72% of voters approve of the performance of the president, 21% disapprove and 7% did not have an opinion.
- The poll shows Women's Development Bank and the 24-Hour Economy are the major government policies voters rated poorly 4.6 and 4.2 out of a score of 10 respectively. No-Academic-Fee policy, the "Big Push", Tax relieves and National Apprenticeship Programme were the best performers, scoring 6.1, 6.0, 5.8 and 5.5 respectively.
- On the big question of the regional tribunal whose Act is awaiting presidential ascent, the poll shows that 63% of voters approve of its establishment, 19% disapprove and 17% did not have an opinion. The poll shows majority of NDC voters, 82%, approve, 55% of floating voters approved of it and 60% of other political parties also approve of it. Among NPP voters, a plurality (45%) approve of the regional tribunals, among those who did not disclose their political parties, 48% approve of the tribunal system.

Summary of Findings

- On the extradition of Abu Trica to the United States to face criminal charges, the poll shows that 42% disagreed with the government for extraditing the Abu Trica before his appeal process against his extradition was completed, while 29% agreed with the government and another 29% did not have an opinion.
- On ‘which global powers Ghanaians view favourably’, the poll shows Canada is the global power Ghanaians see most favourably with net favourability rating of 38 points, followed by China, 34 points, United Kingdom, 33 points, European Union, 22 points and the United State, 7 points. The countries with the least favourability rating are South Africa, negative 61 points, Russia, negative 6 points and Russia, negative 3 points.
- On the race to lead the NDC in 2028, the poll shows a dead heat between the NDC chairman, Johnson Asiedu Nketia and the finance minister, Cassiel Ato Baah Forson. Both potential candidates are on 31% apiece, Haruna Iddrisu, education minister, 15%, Prof Opoku-Agyemang, the vice president, 9%. Julius Debrah, the Chief of Staff, 8%, Eirc Opoku, Agric. Minister, 2% and Prof Joshua Alabi, 2%.
- For the 2028 elections outlook, if Ato Forson, Mahamudu Bawumia, Kennedy Agyapong, Alan Kyeremanten and Nana Bediako are the candidates, the poll shows Ato Forson leads with nearly 57.5%, Mahamudu Bawumia, 35.3%, Kennedy Agyapong, 4.3%, Alan Kyeremanten, 0.5%, Nana Bediako, 0.6% and others 1.8%



Summary of Findings

- However, if the race is between Asiedu Nketia, Mahamudu Bawumia, Kennedy Agyapong, Alan Kyeremanten and Nana Bediako are the candidates, the poll shows Asiedu Nketia leads with 54.2%, Mahamudu Bawumia, 37.1%, Kennedy Agyapong, 4.8%, Alan Kyeremanten, 1.0%, Nana Kwame Bediako, 0.8% and others 2.1%
- The telephone interviews, which will be a longitudinal, was carried from 15th -24th July 2026 with a sample of 7,761 voters from all the 16 regions in Ghana. The poll has confidence level of 99% and margin of error of $\pm 1.5\%$.
- 34% of the sample selected were NPP voters, 45% were NDC voters, 12% were floating voters, 2% other political parties and 7% not disclosed party affiliates. However, after confirmation of the political parties by voters, NPP was 28%, NDC, 44%, floating voters, 18%, other parties, 2% and not disclosed, 8%. The poll is weighted by regional and party affiliations only.

Methodology and Approach

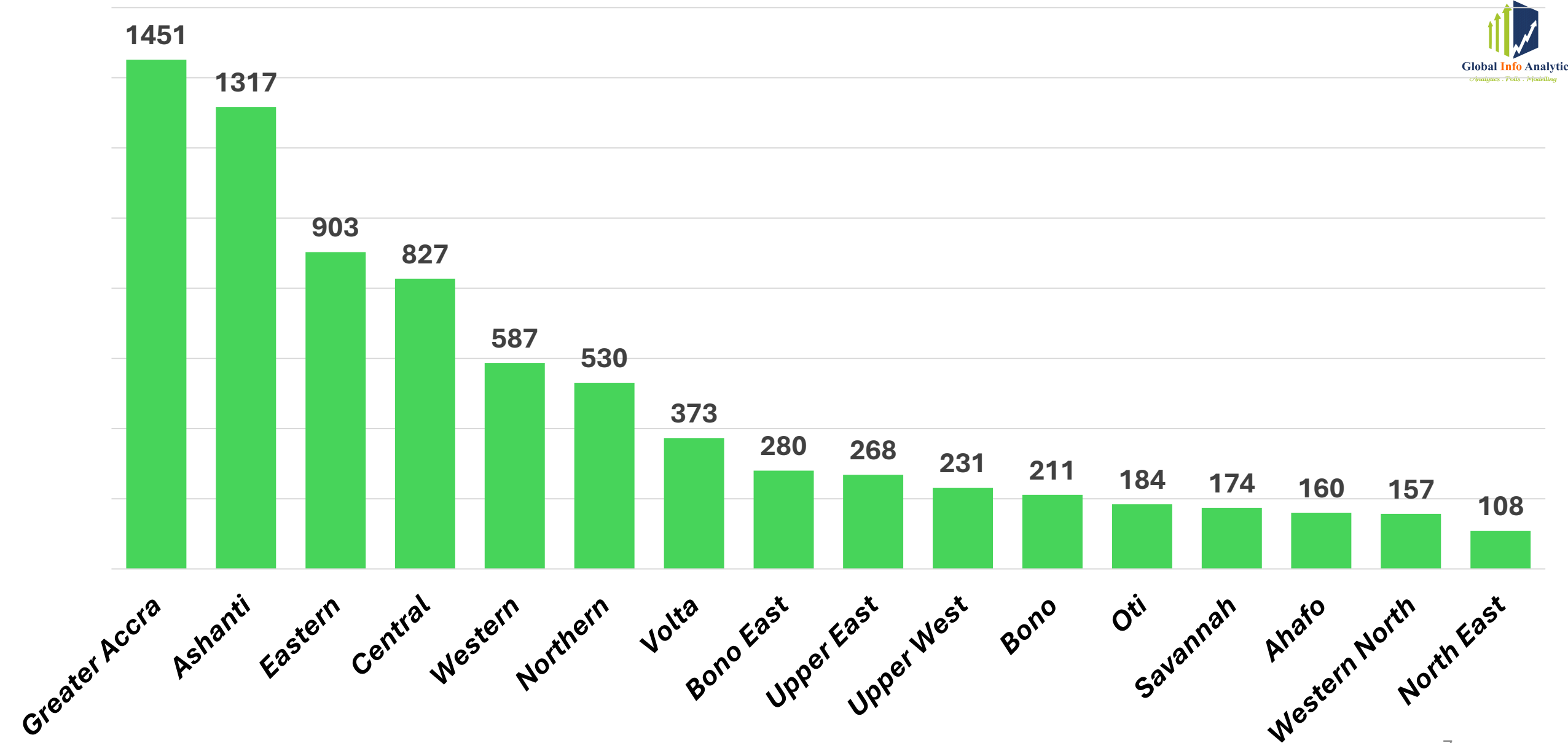

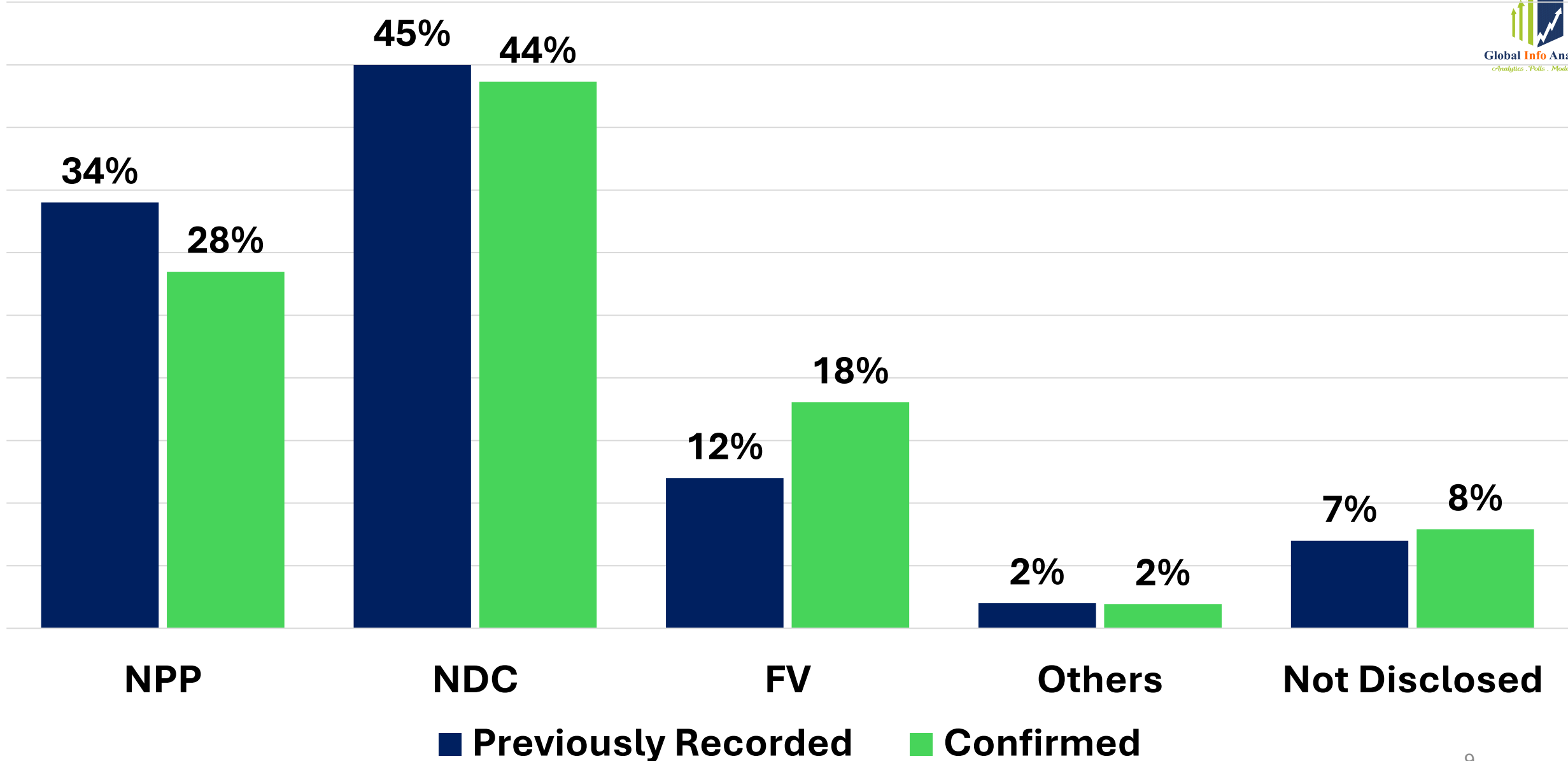

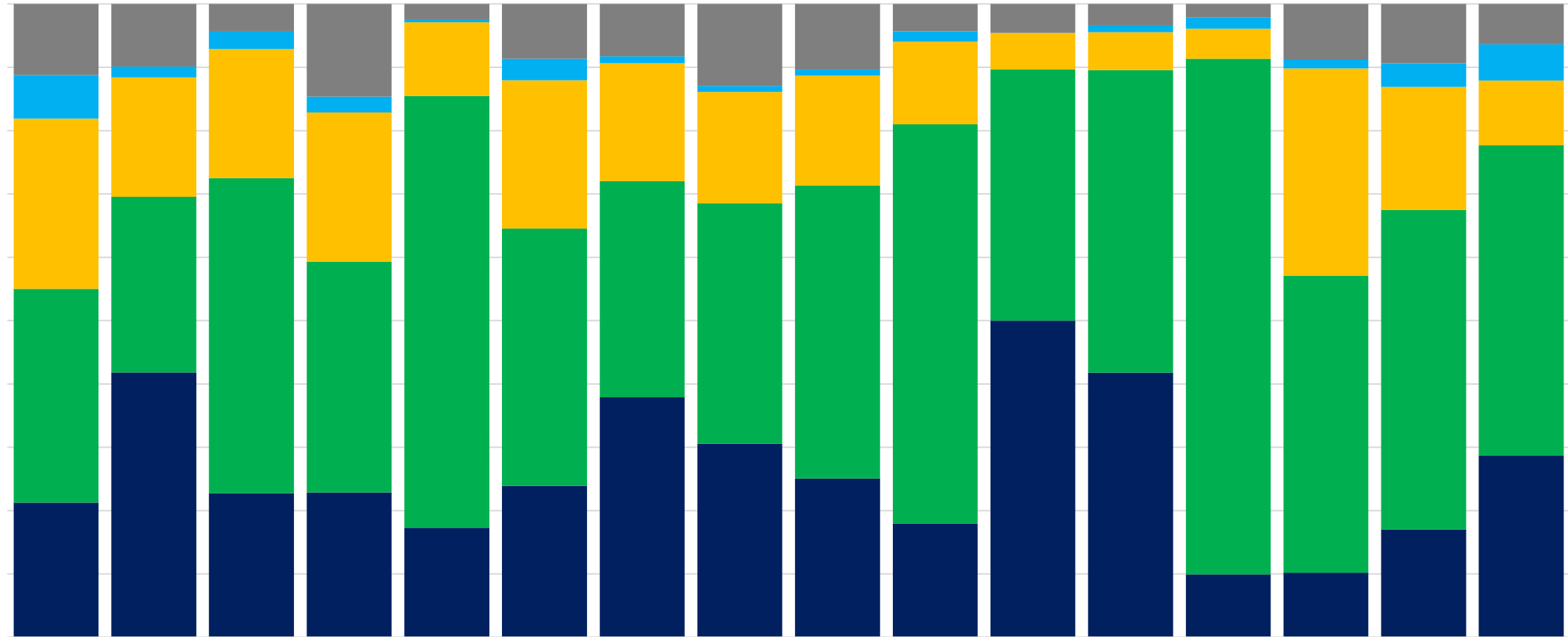

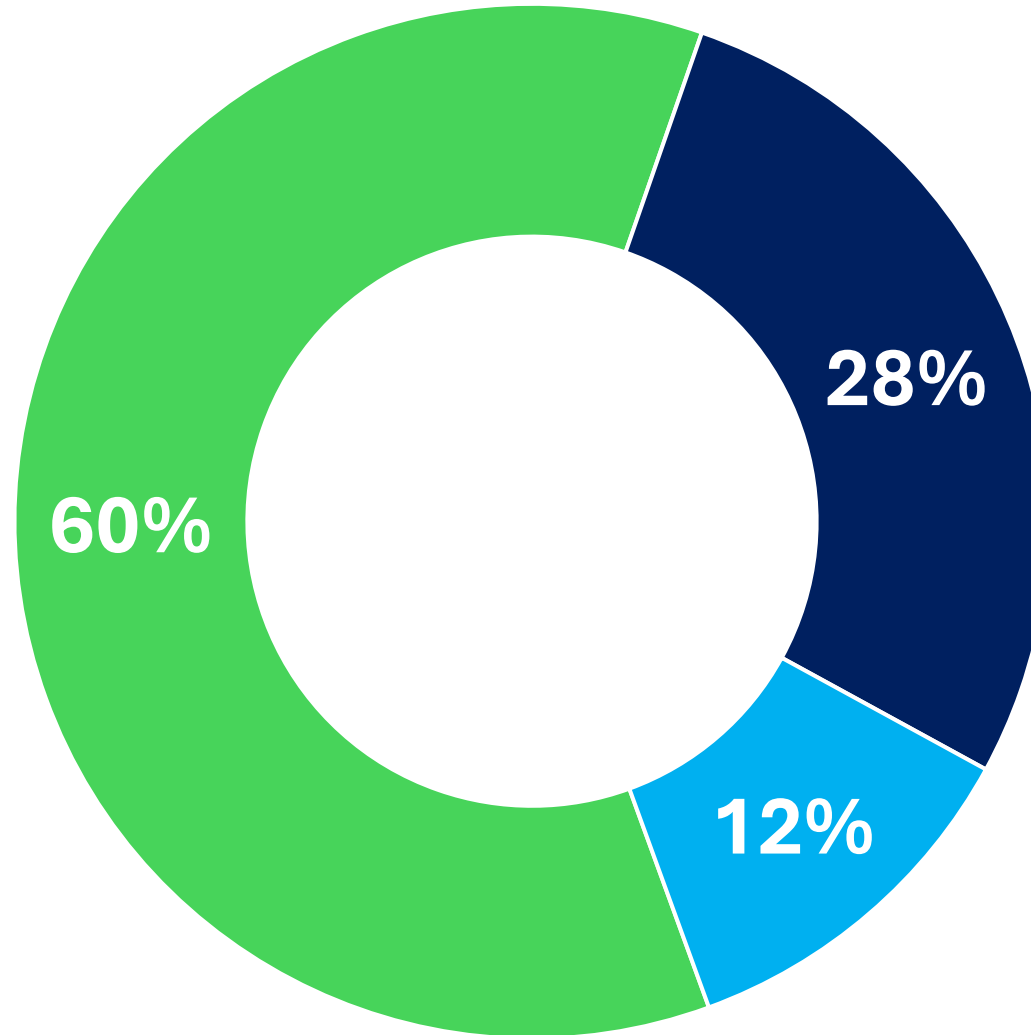

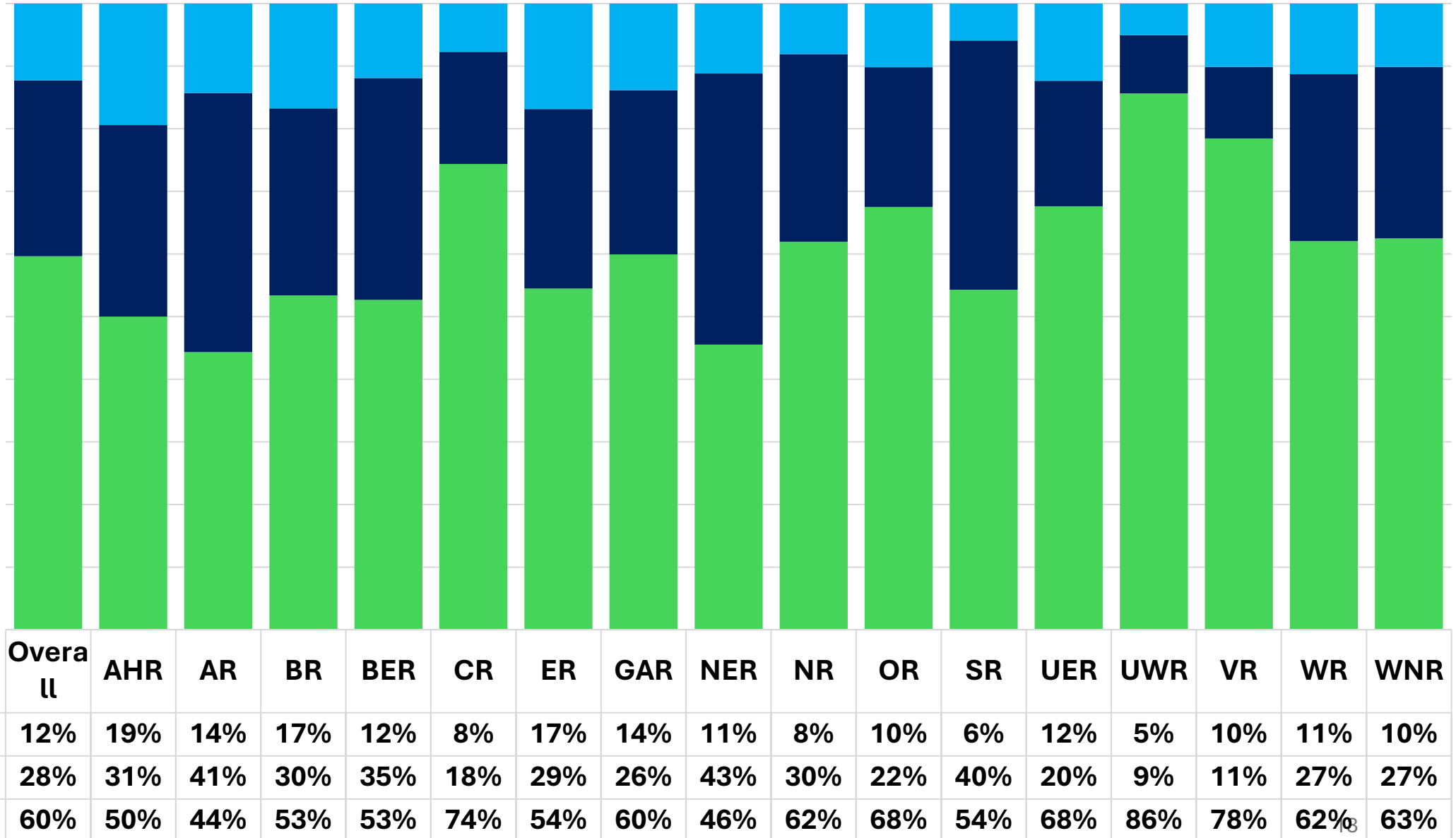

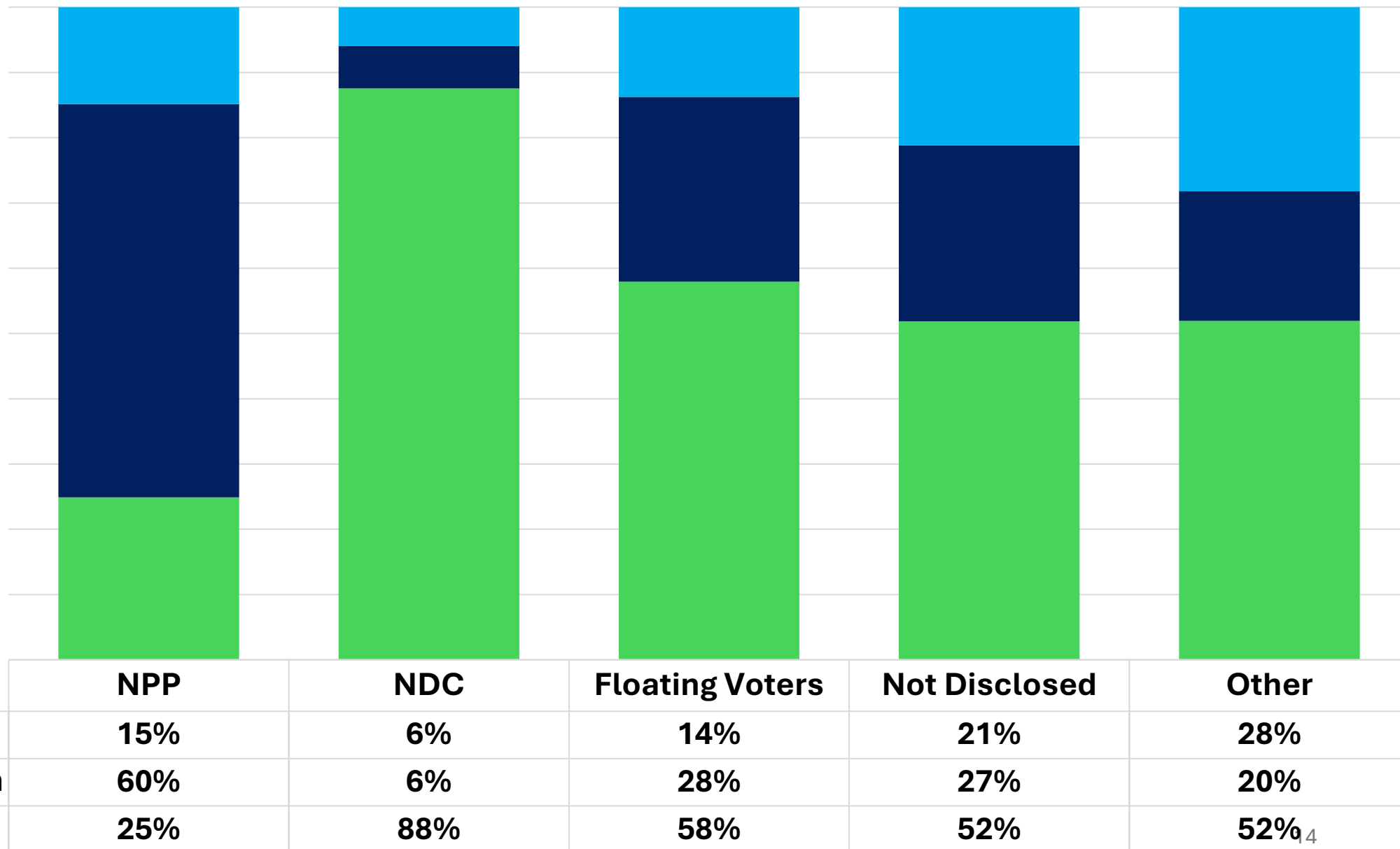

Direction of the country-Regions



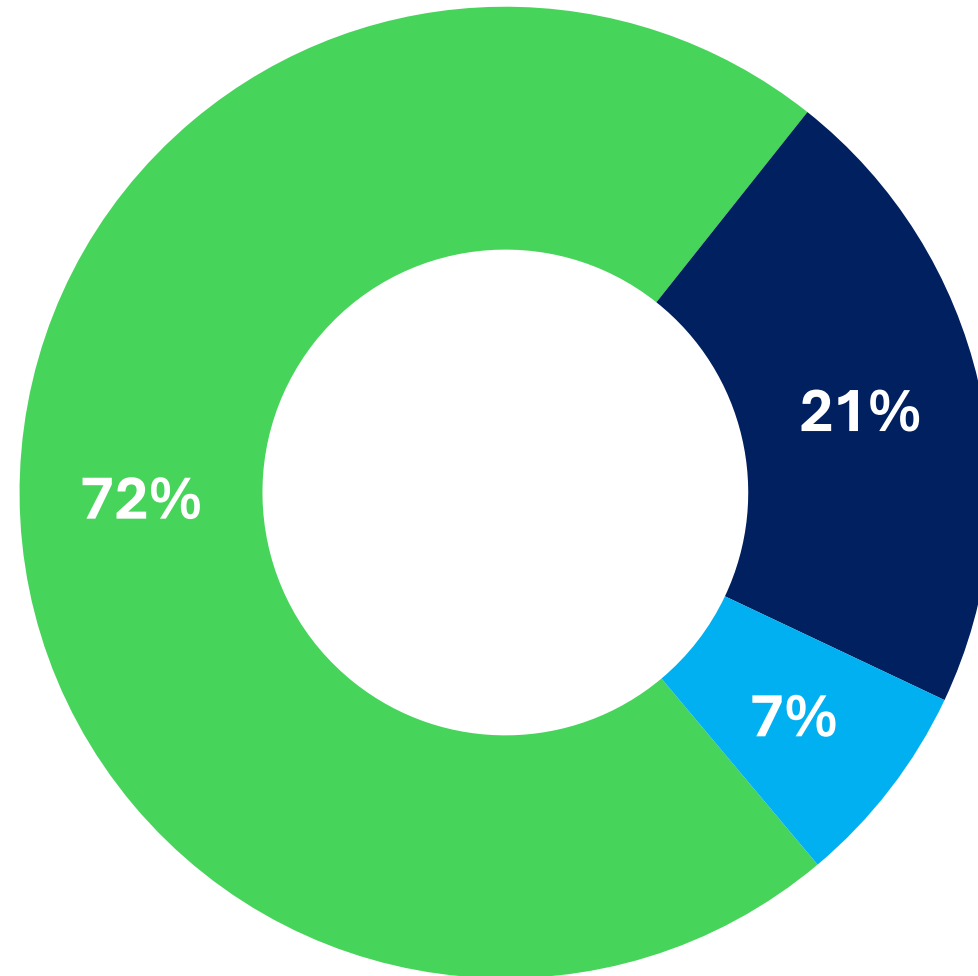
Direction of the country-Party Affiliation

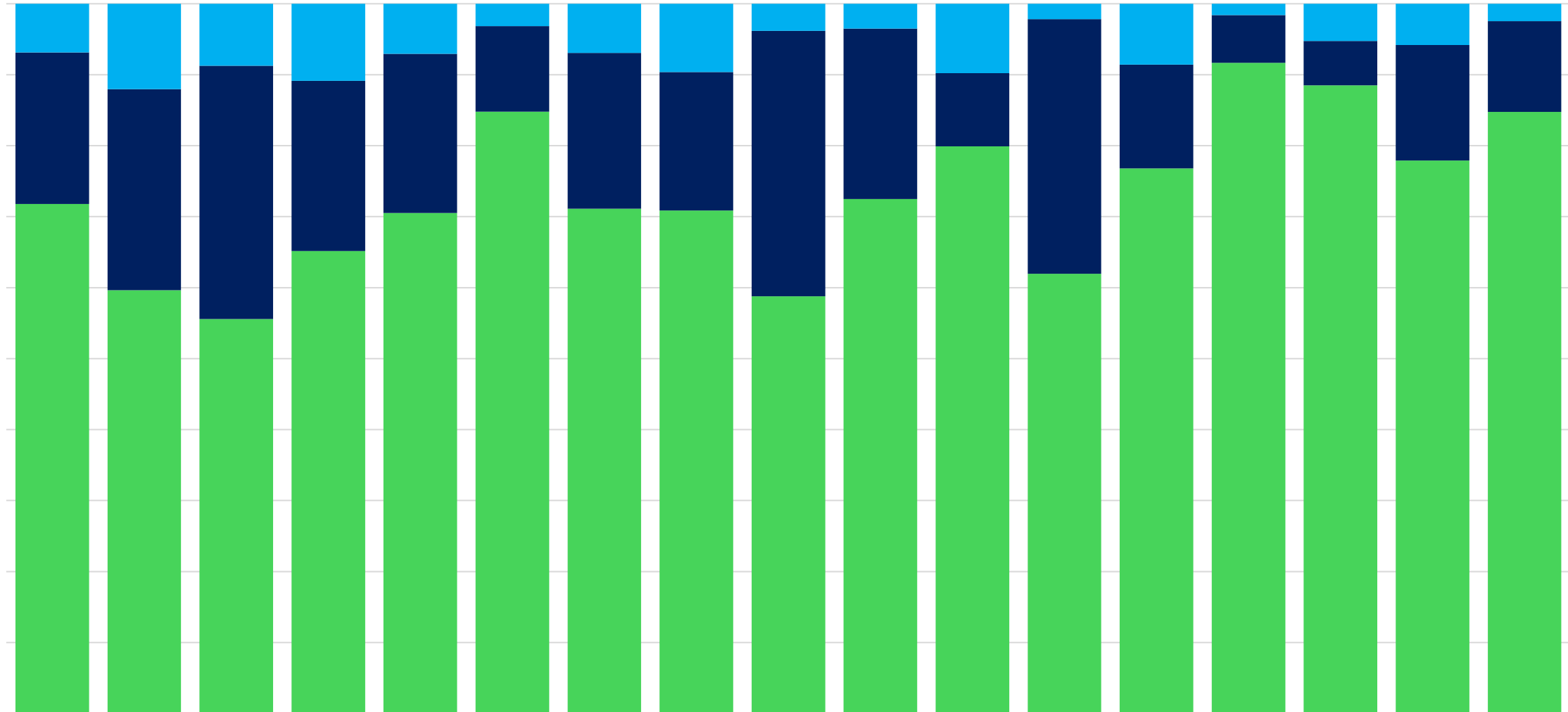

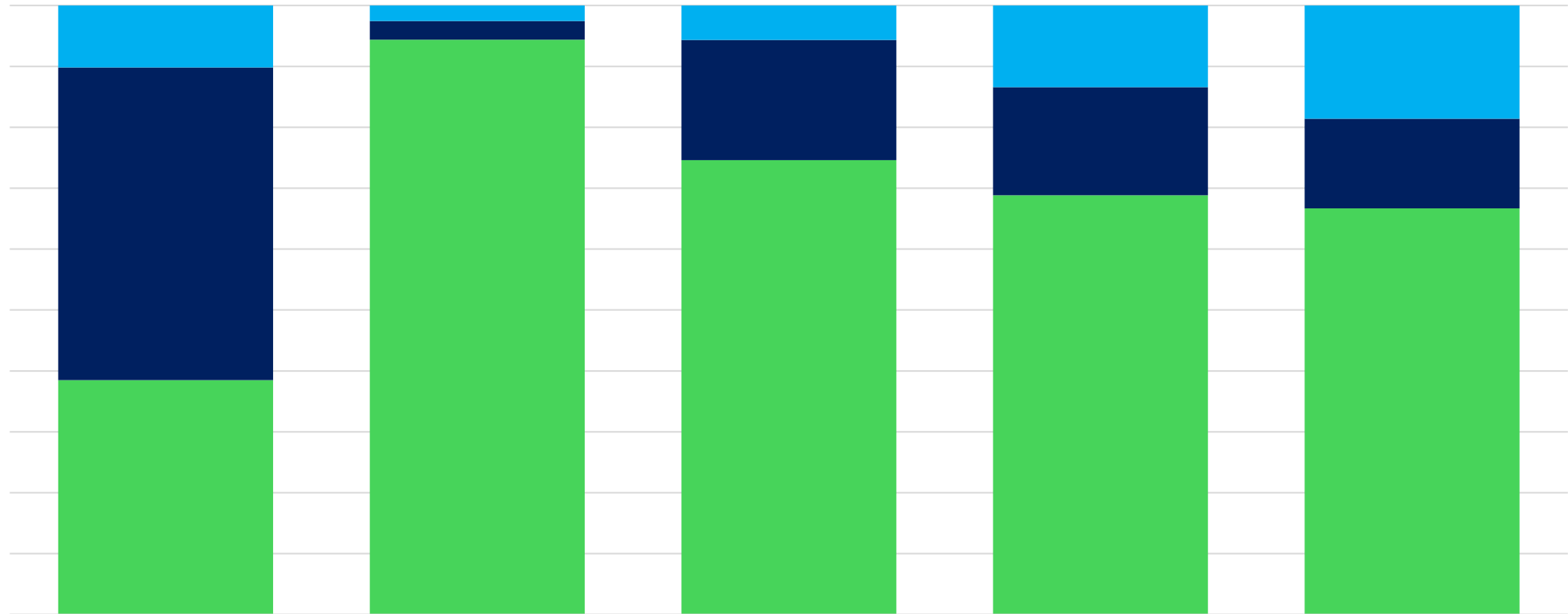

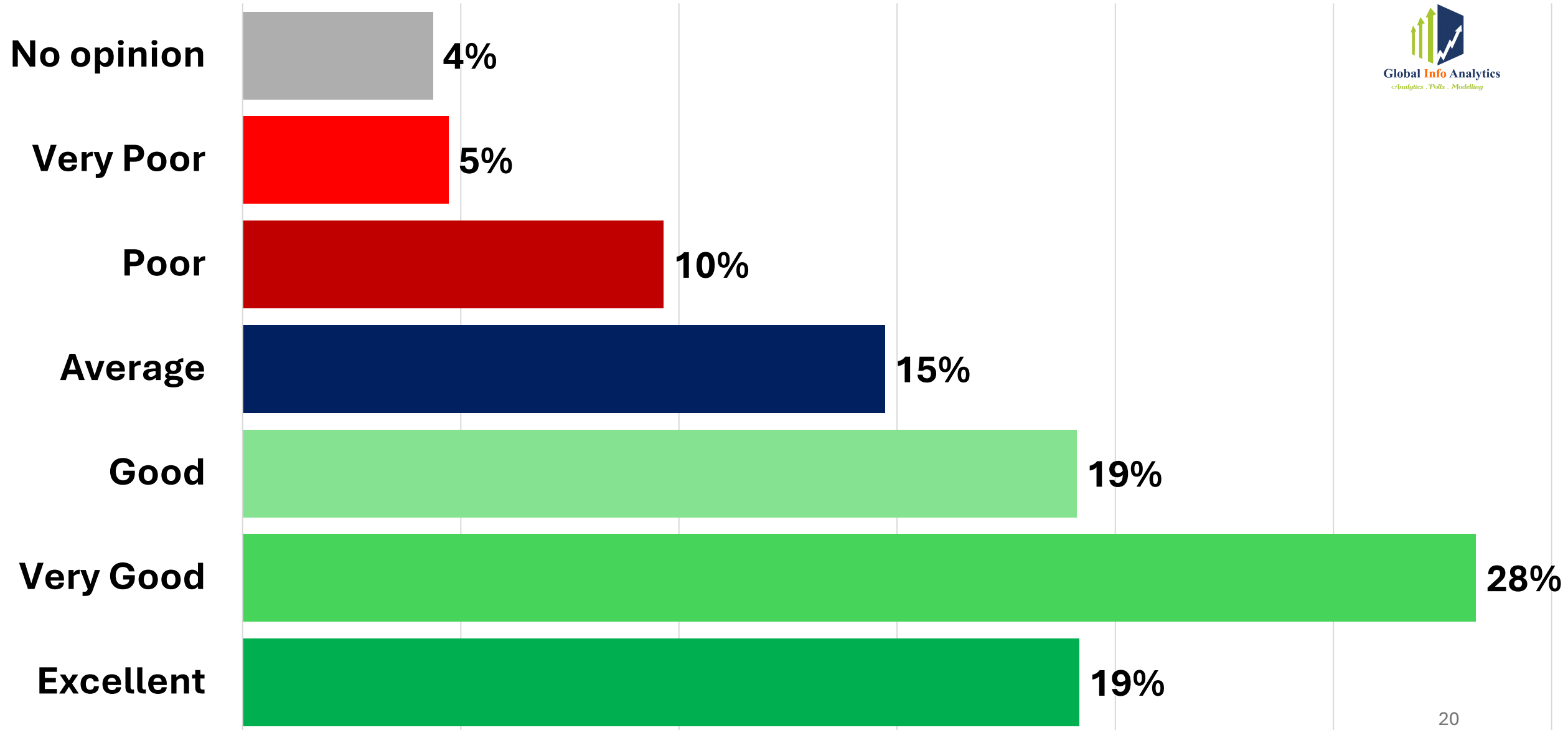

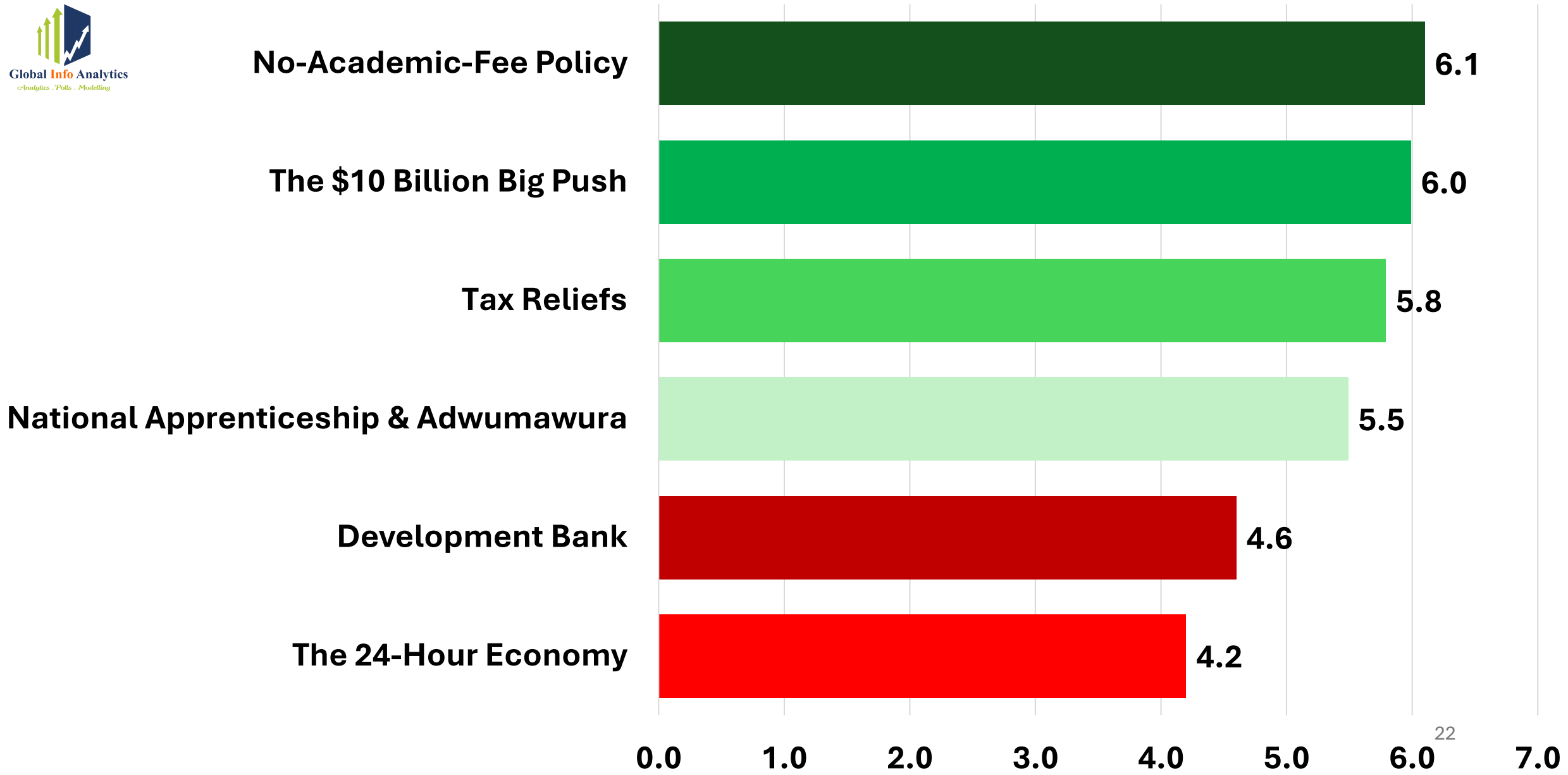

Ratings of Key Government Policies

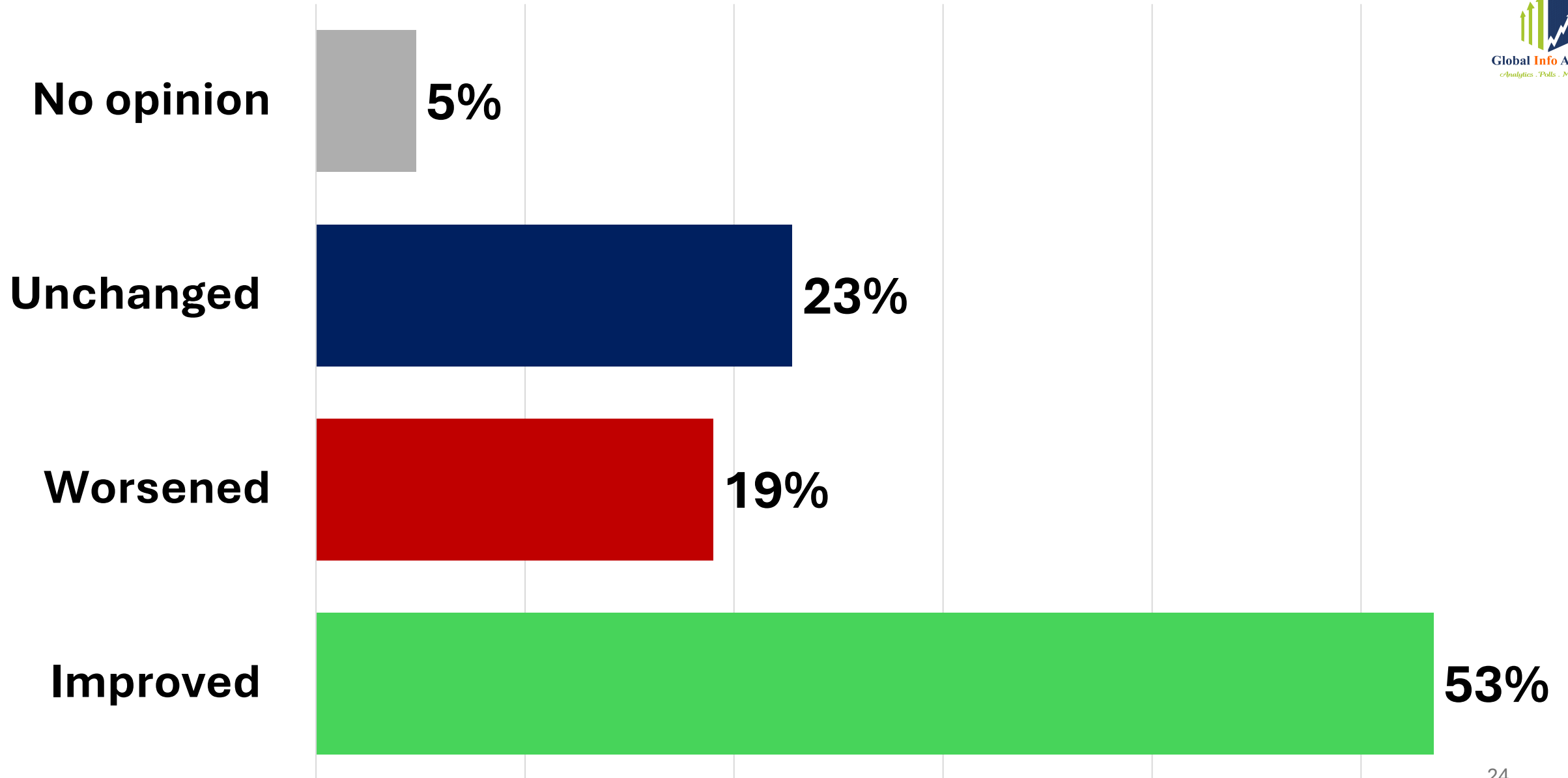

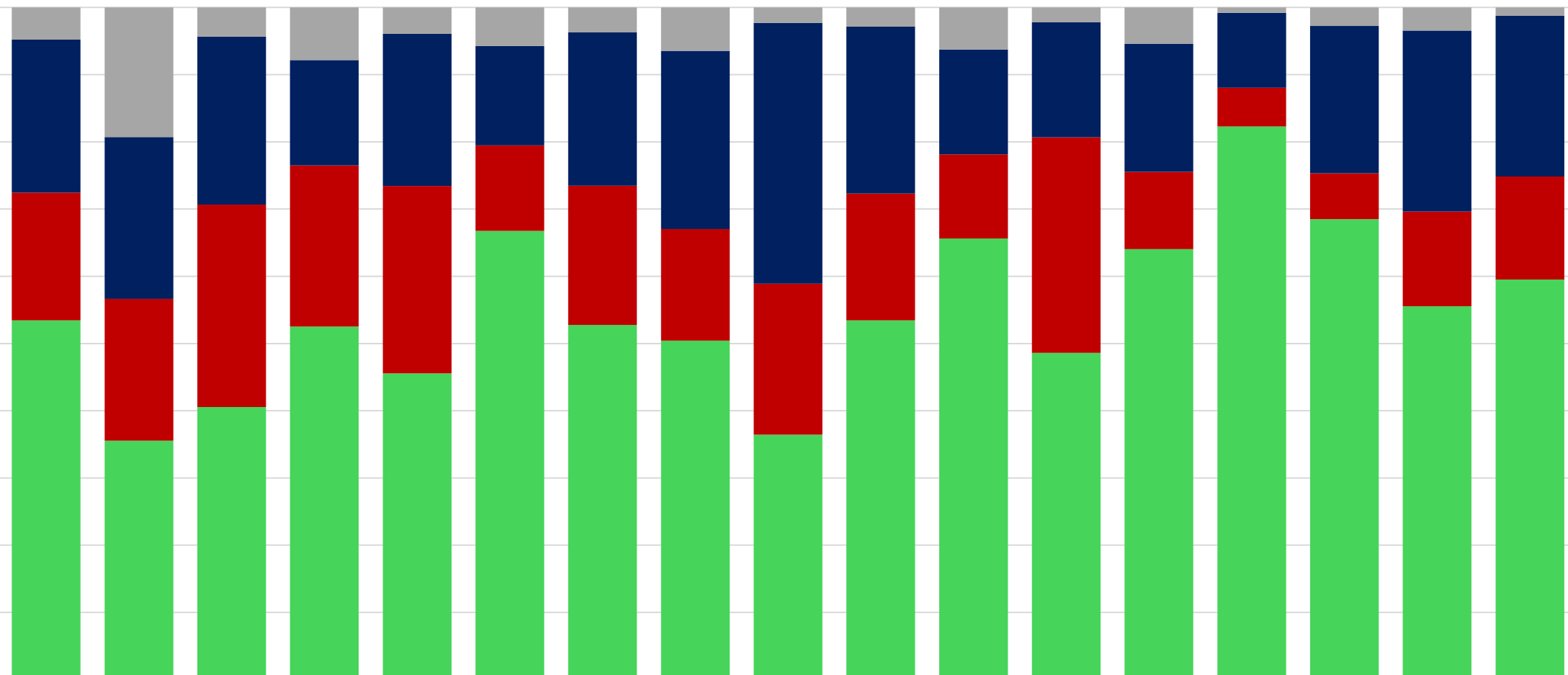
Standard of Living Compared to a year ago



Standard of Living Compared to July 2025

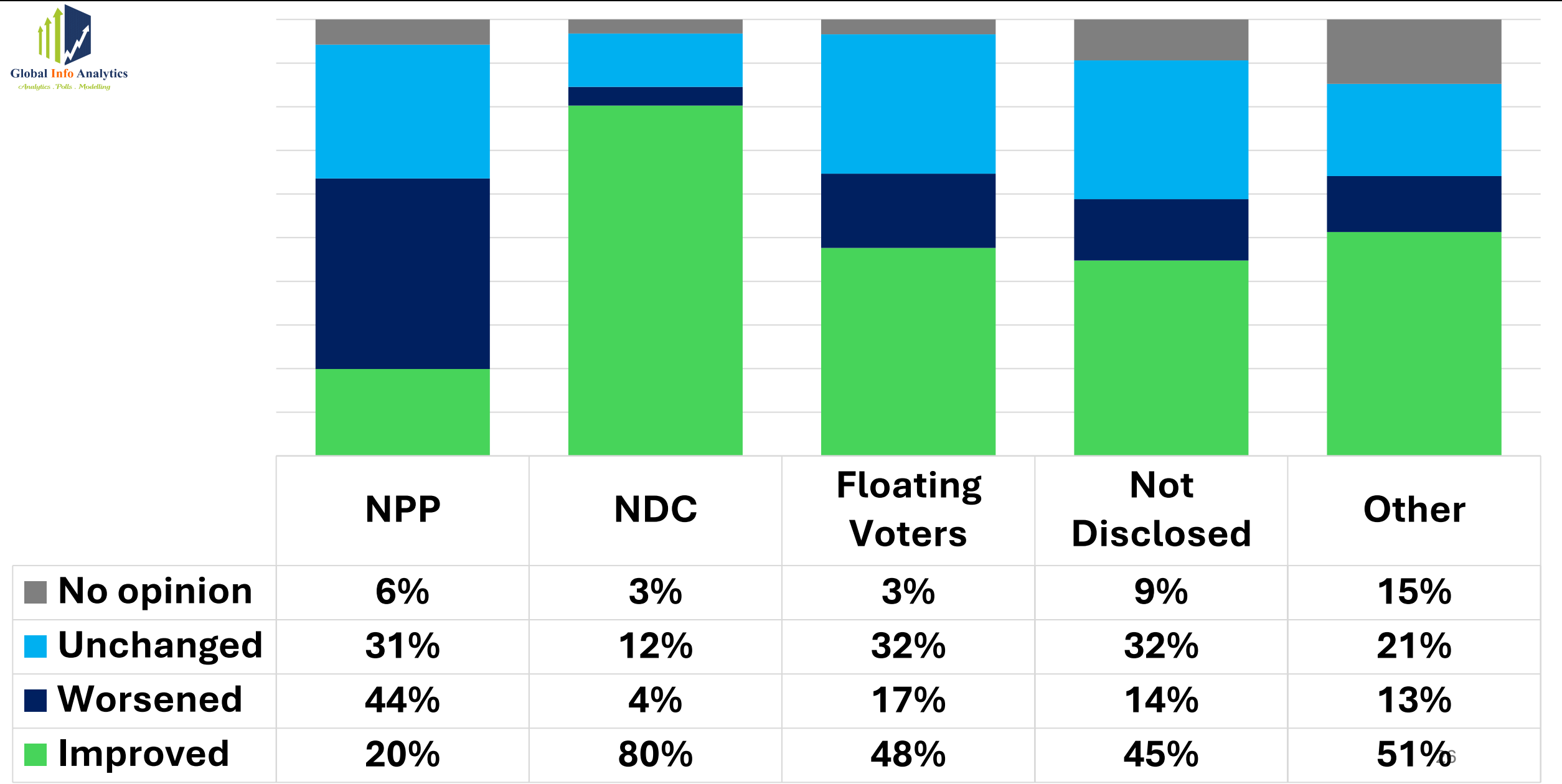

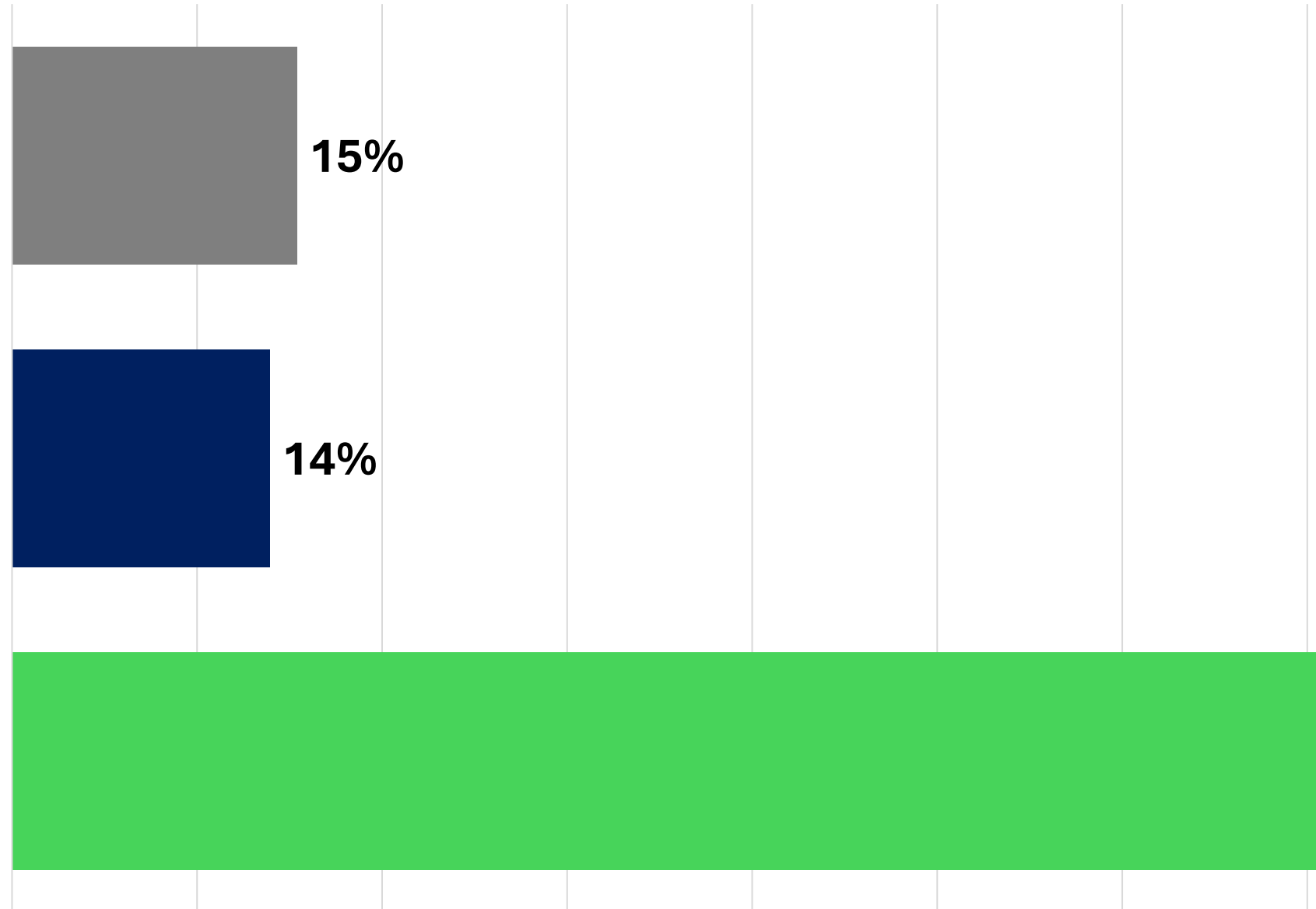

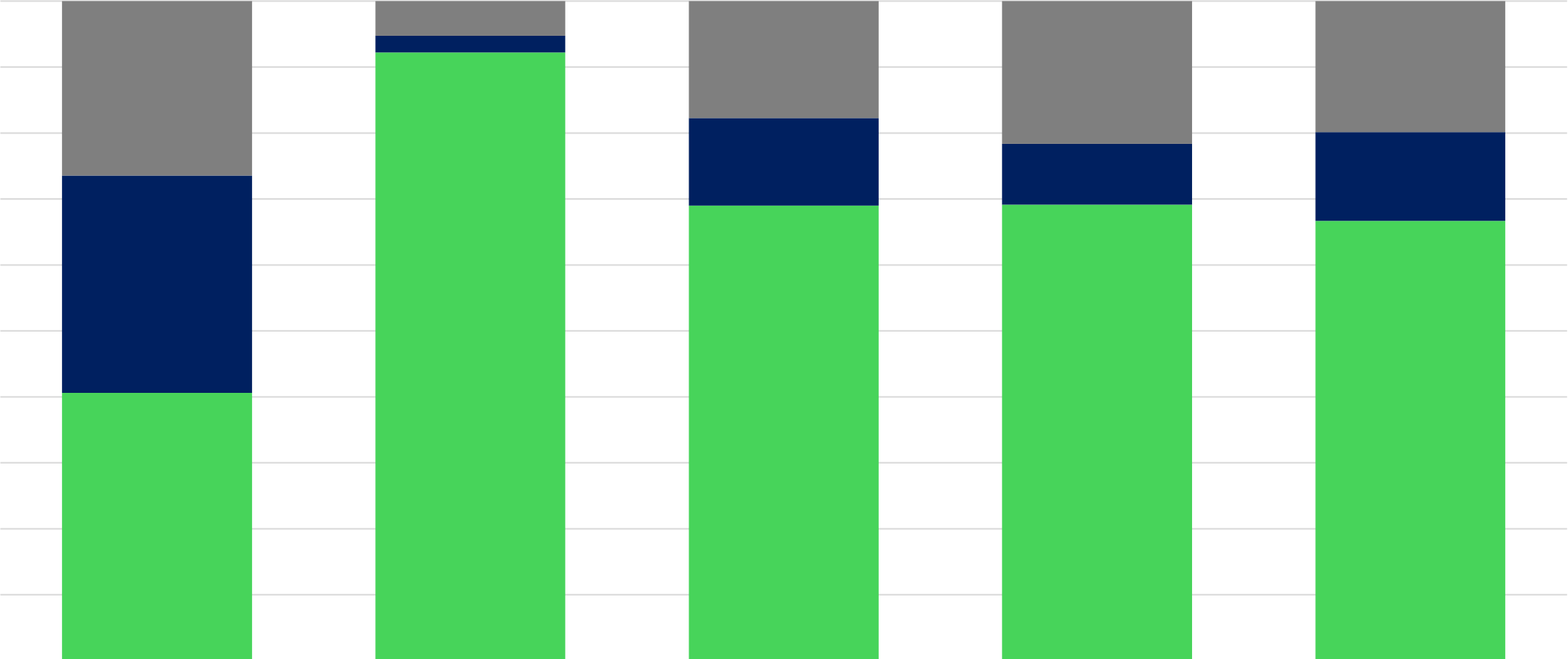


Optimism for Improvement in Standard of Living-Regions

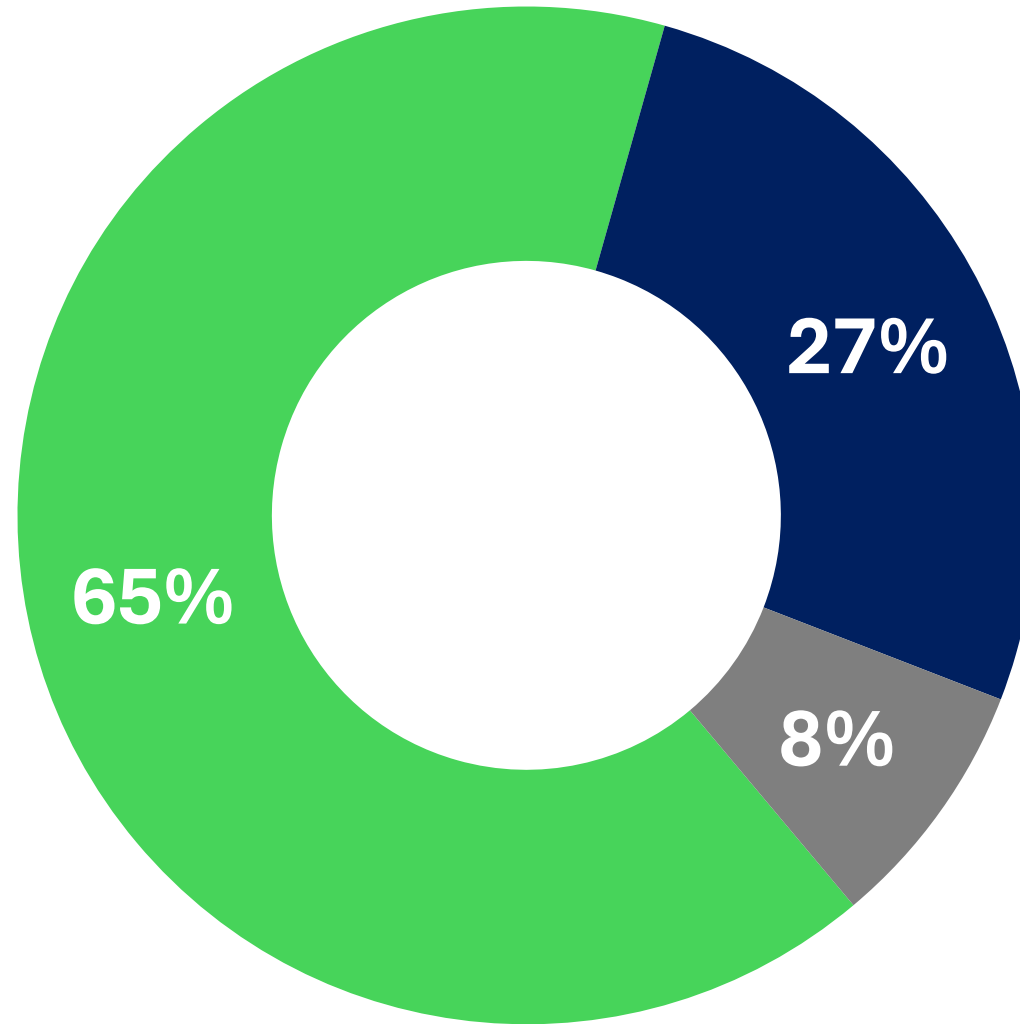

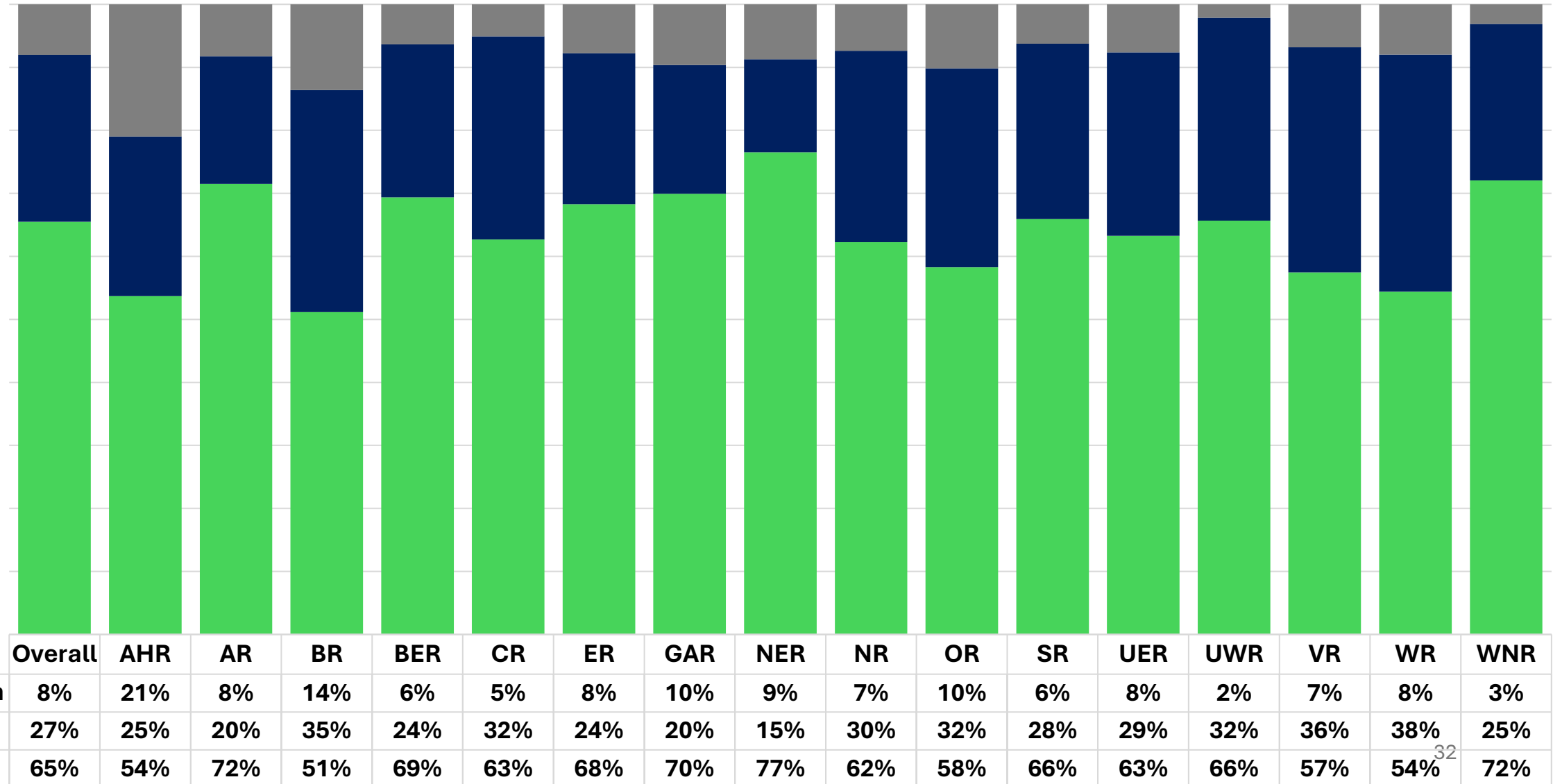


JDM says he will not seek for a 3rd Term- Do you agree/disagree with him?

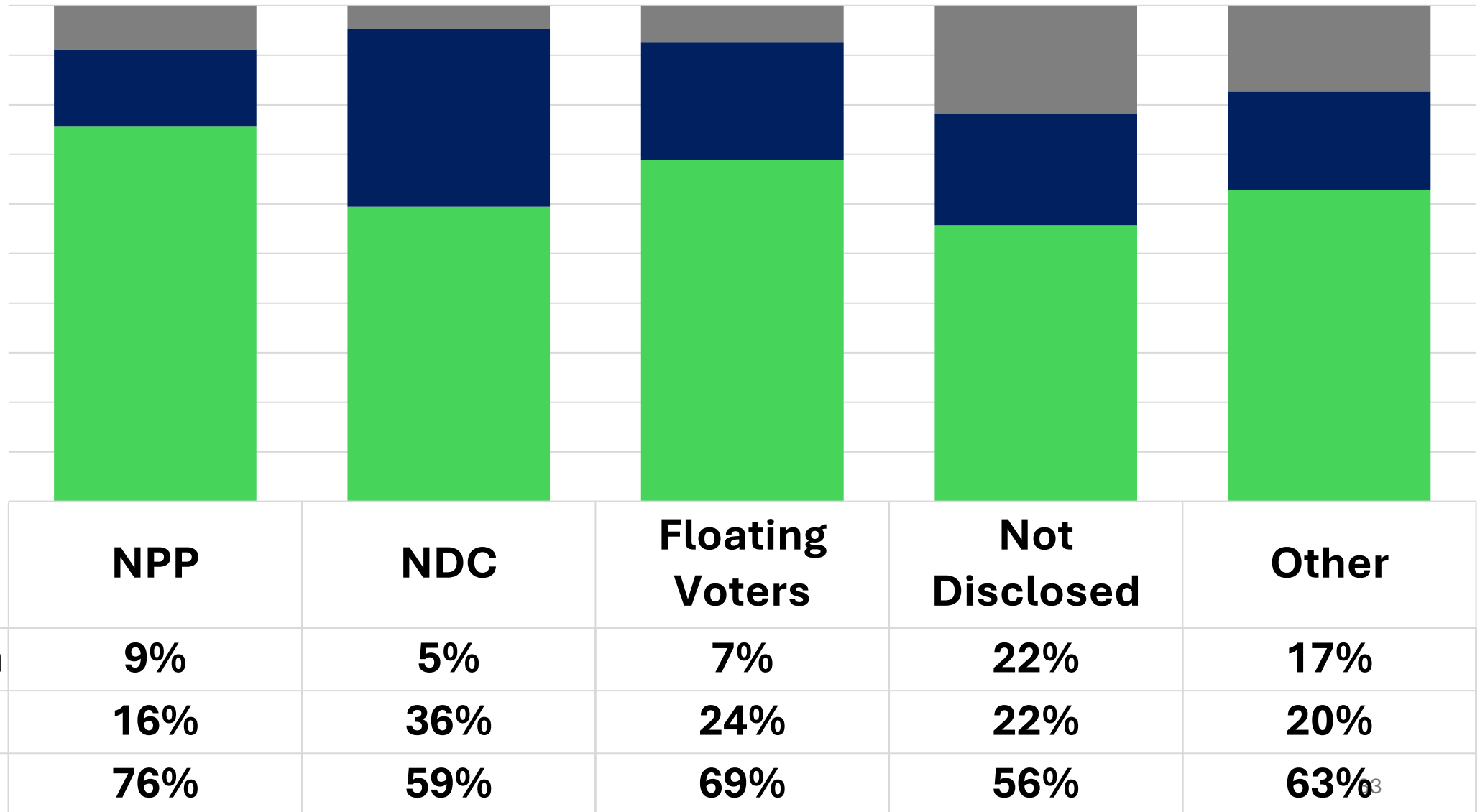

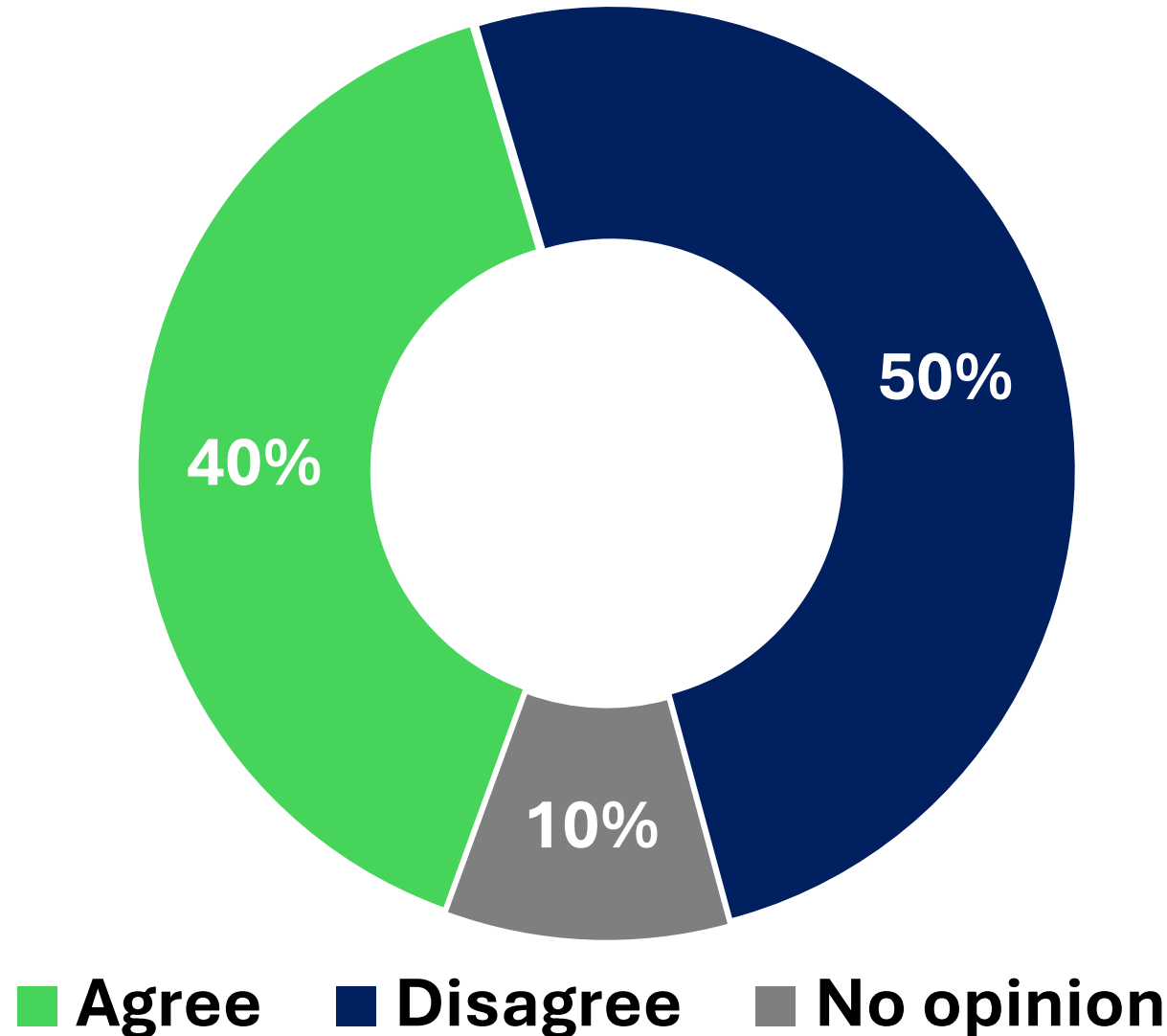
JDM says he will not seek for a 3rd Term- Do you agree/disagree with him? Regions



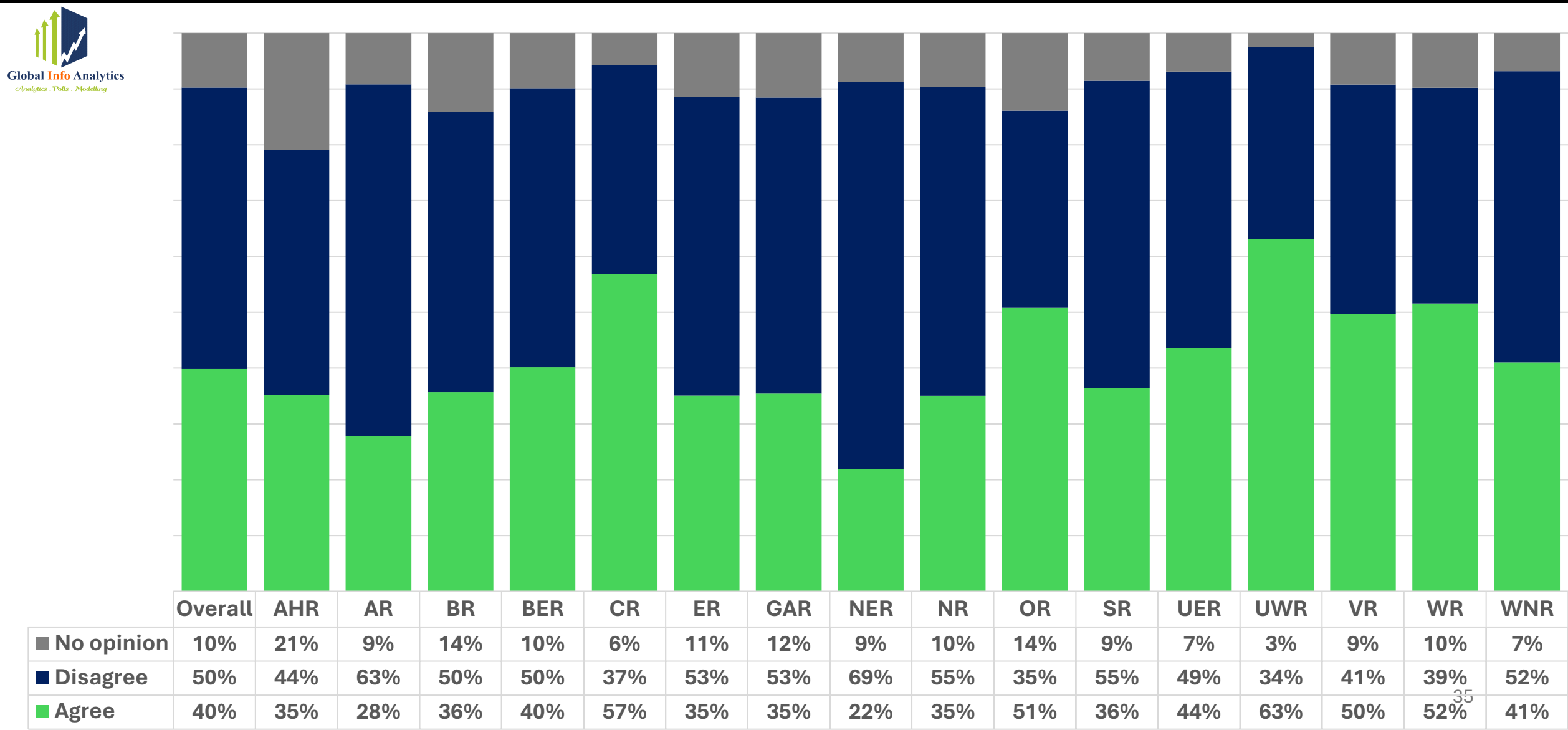
JDM says he will not seek for a 3rd Term- Do you agree/disagree with him? Party Affiliations



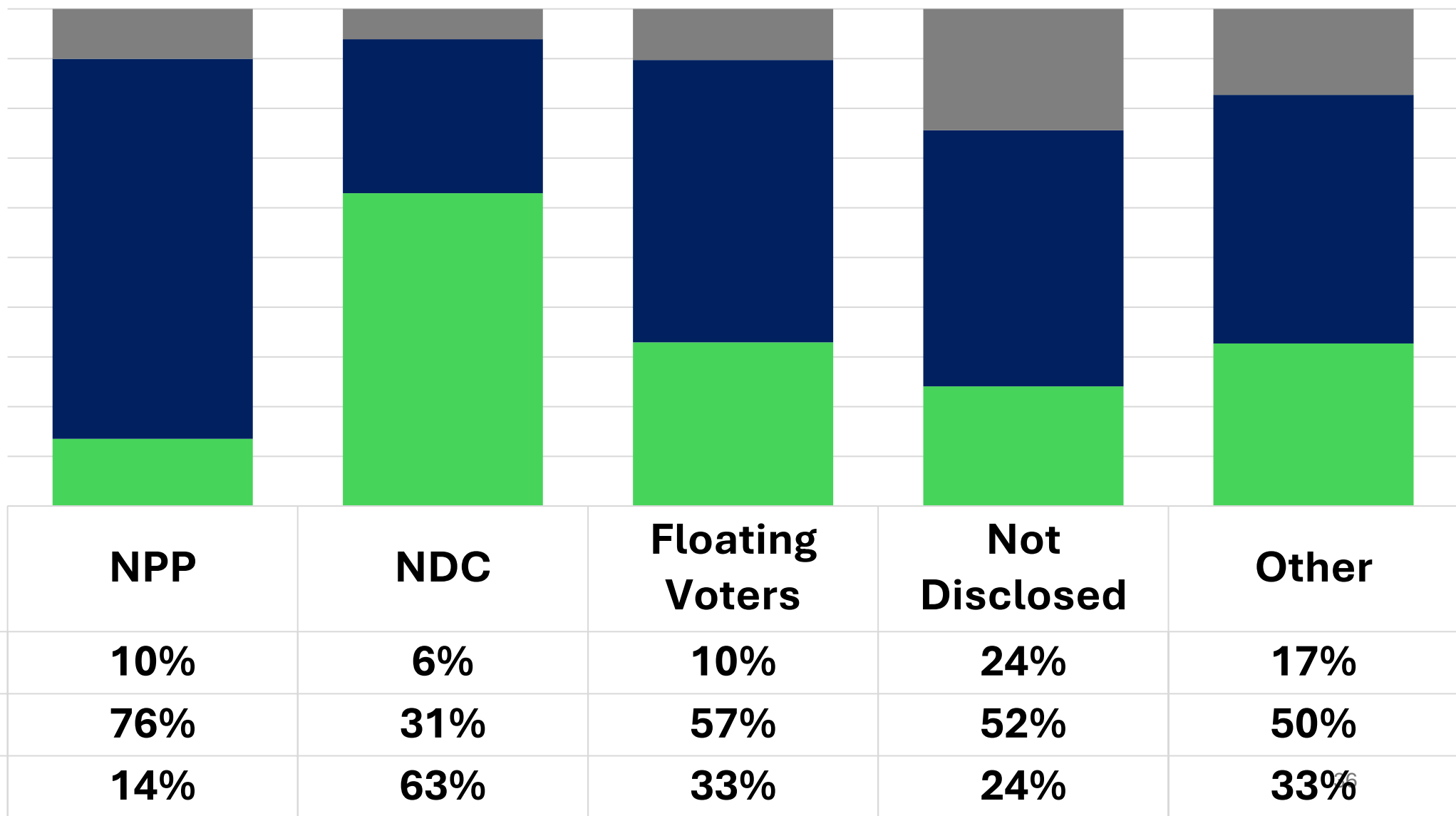
Do you agree/disagree with the call for JDM to go for a 3rd Term?



Do you agree/disagree with the call for JDM to go for a 3rd Term? Regions



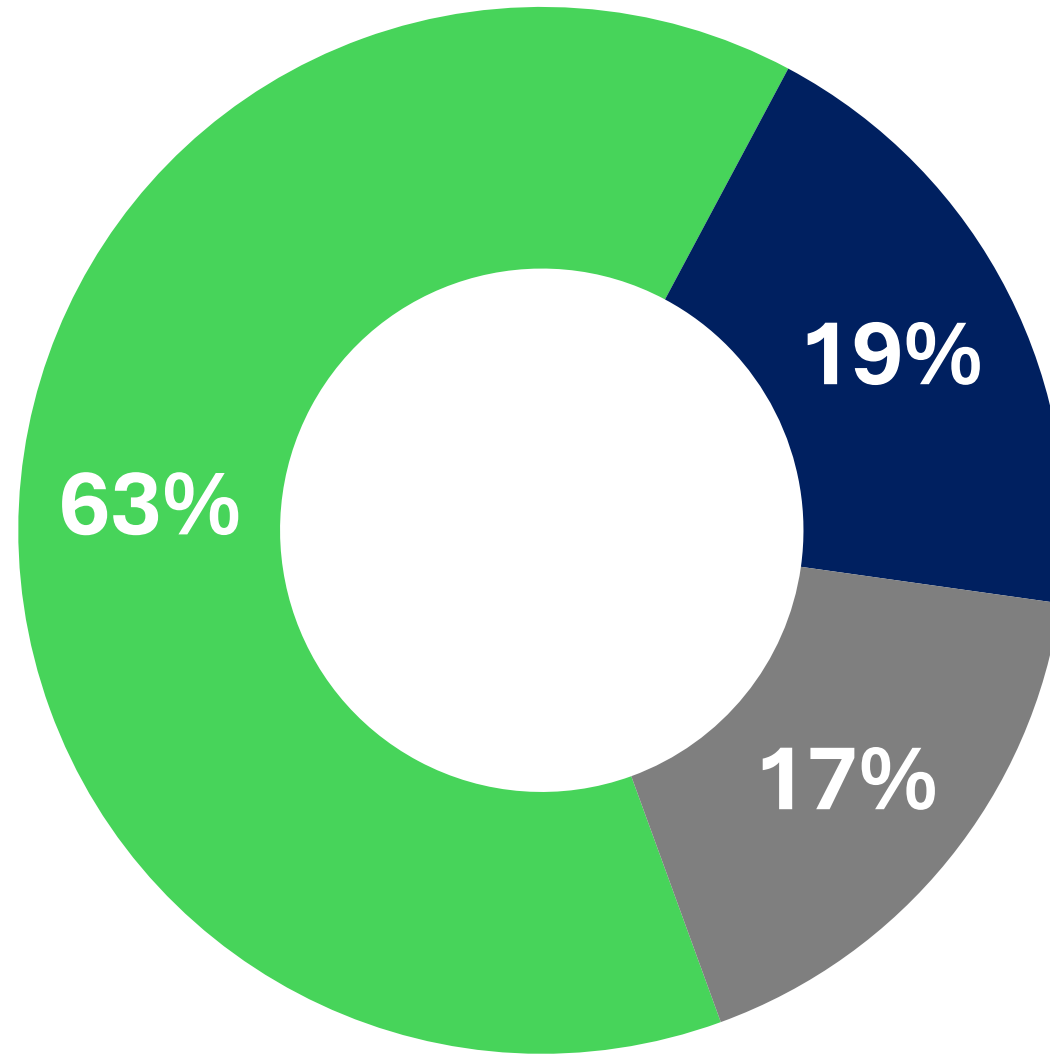

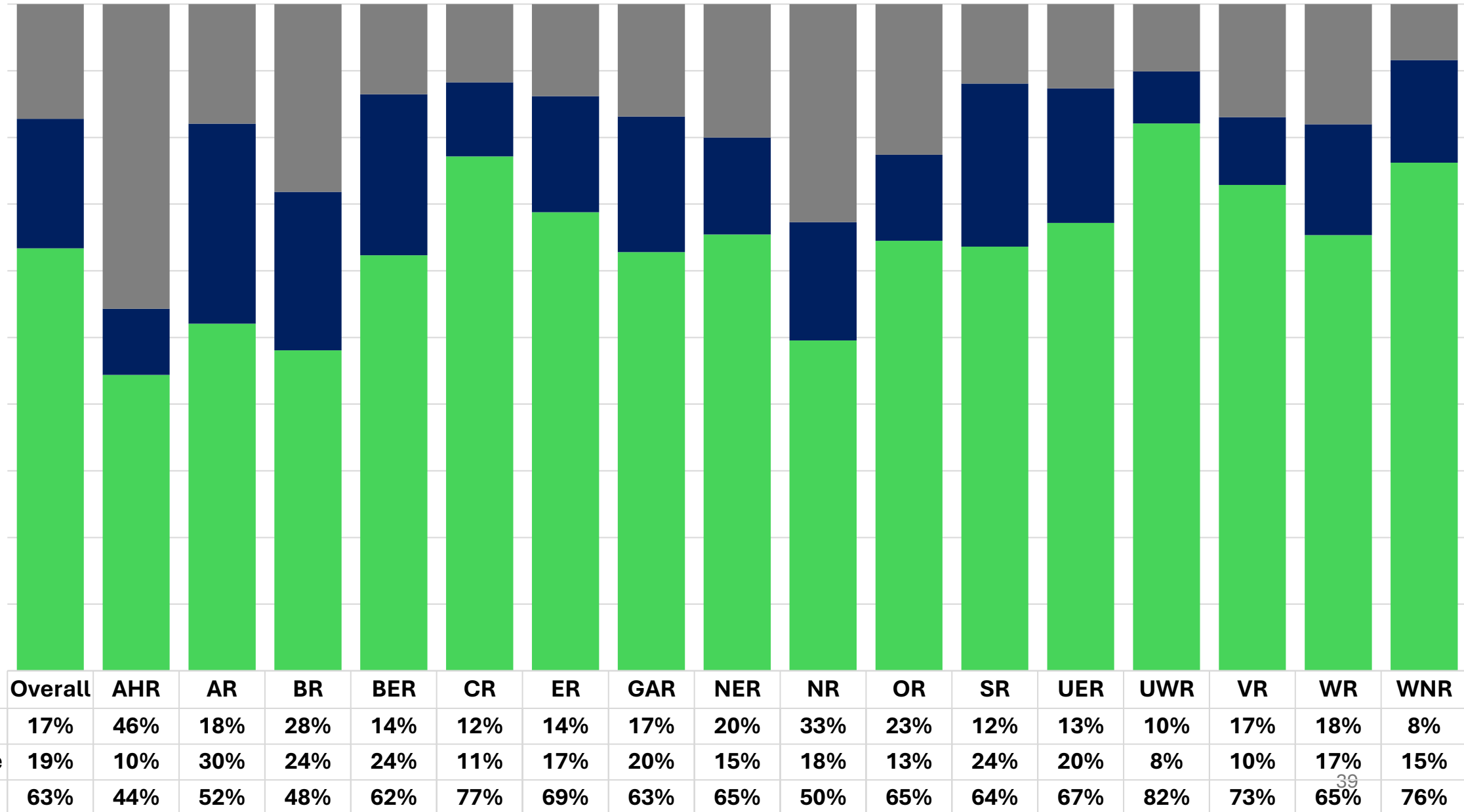

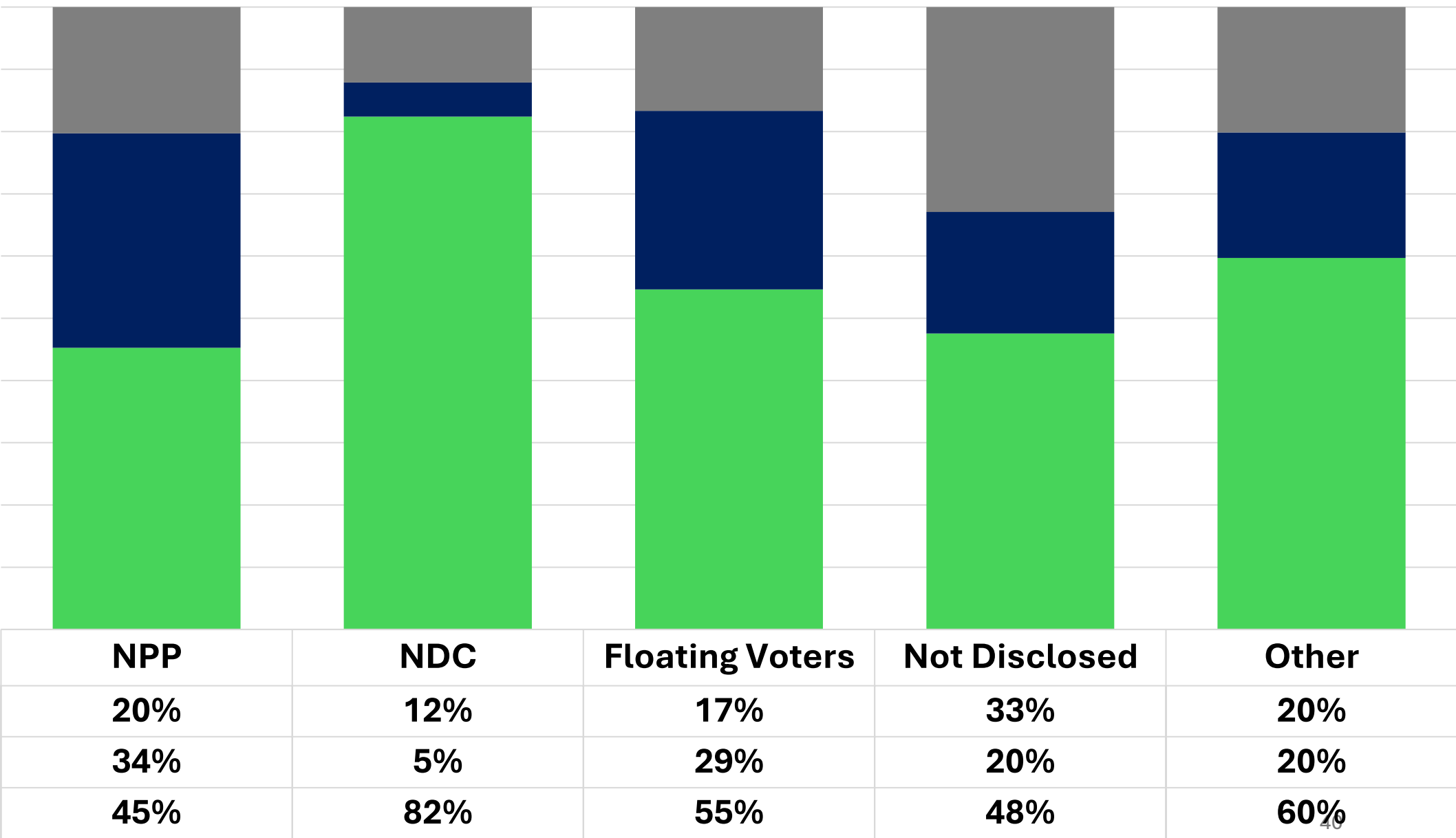

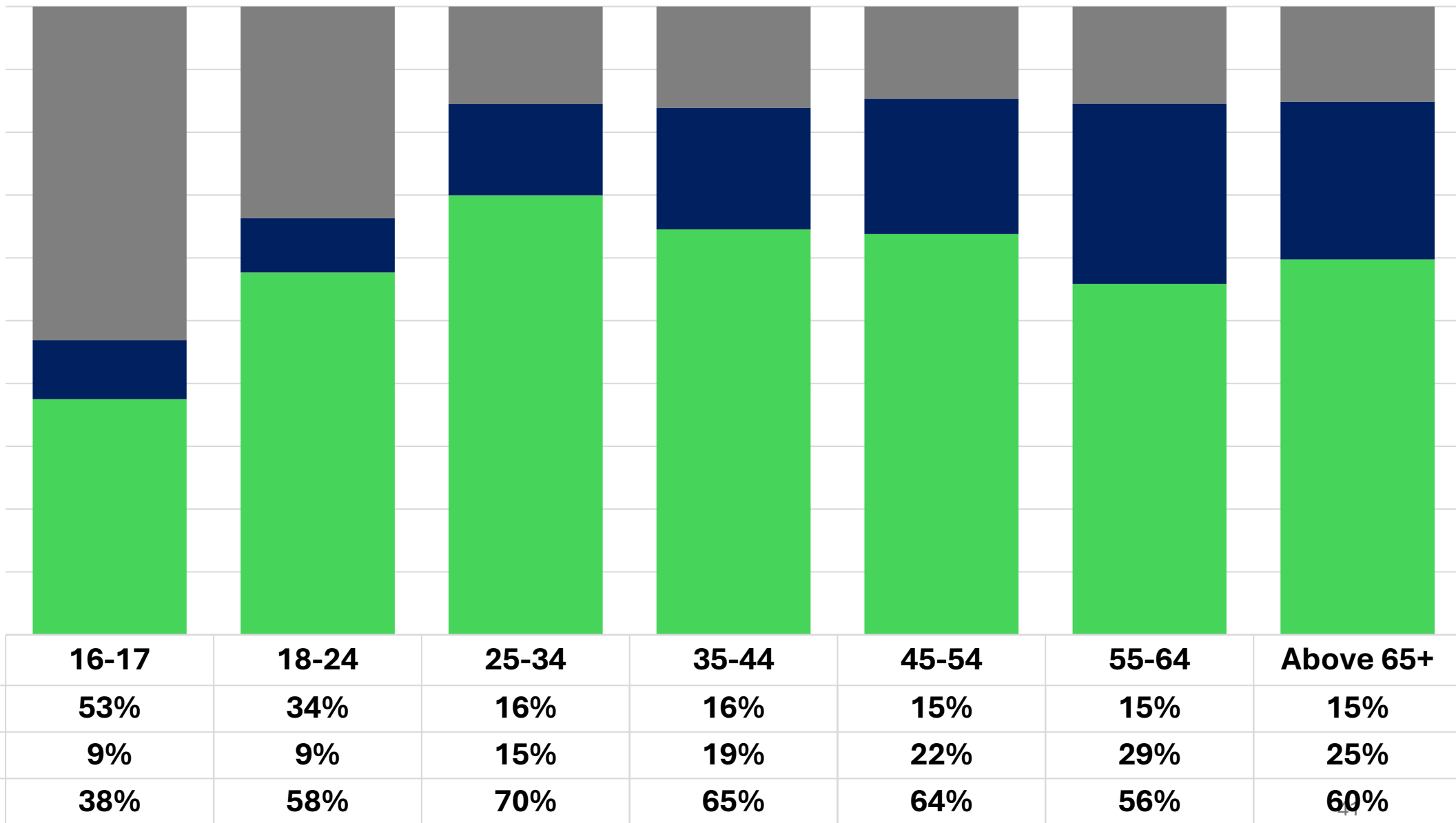

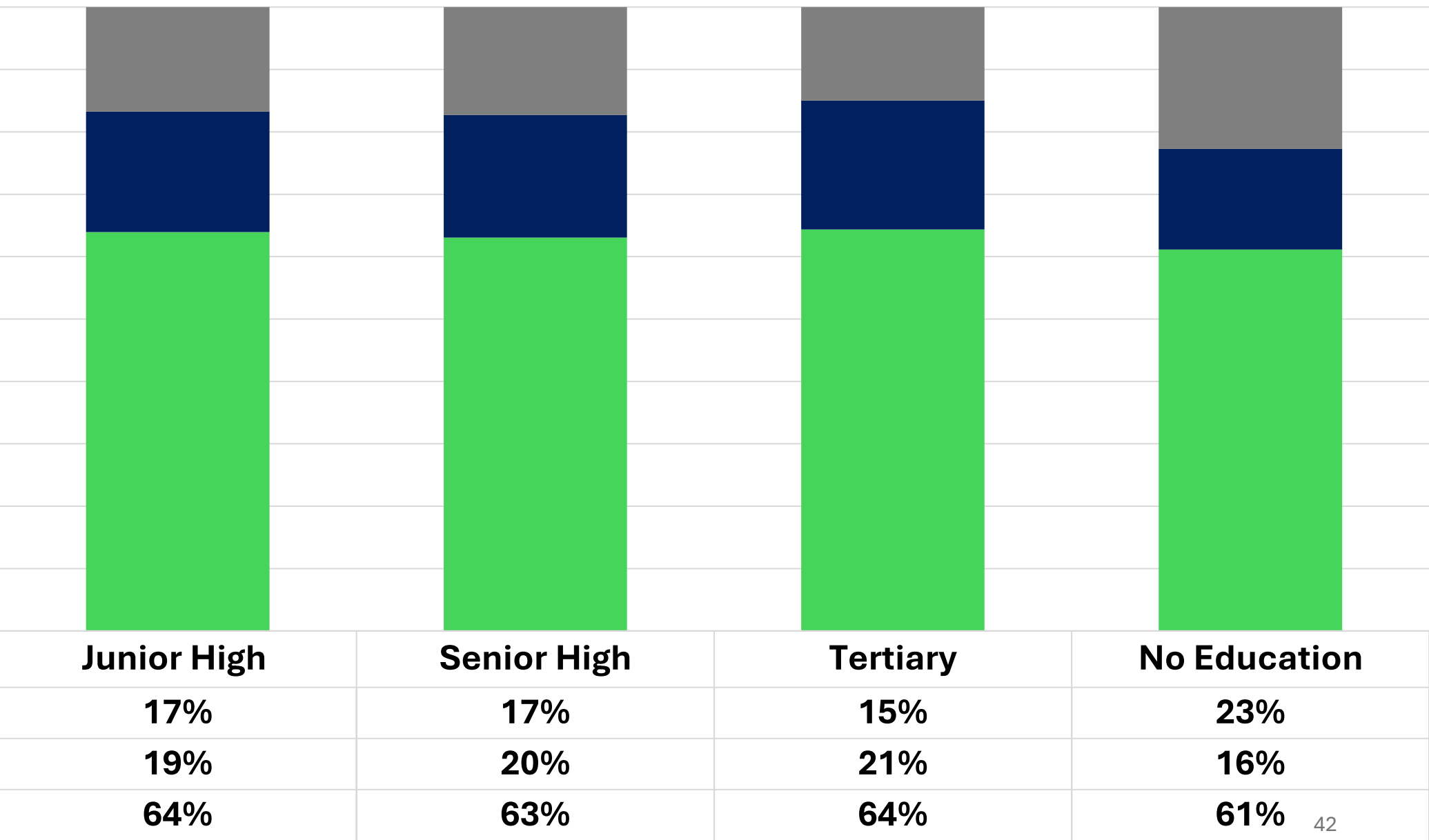
Approval of Regional Tribunals-Party Affiliation

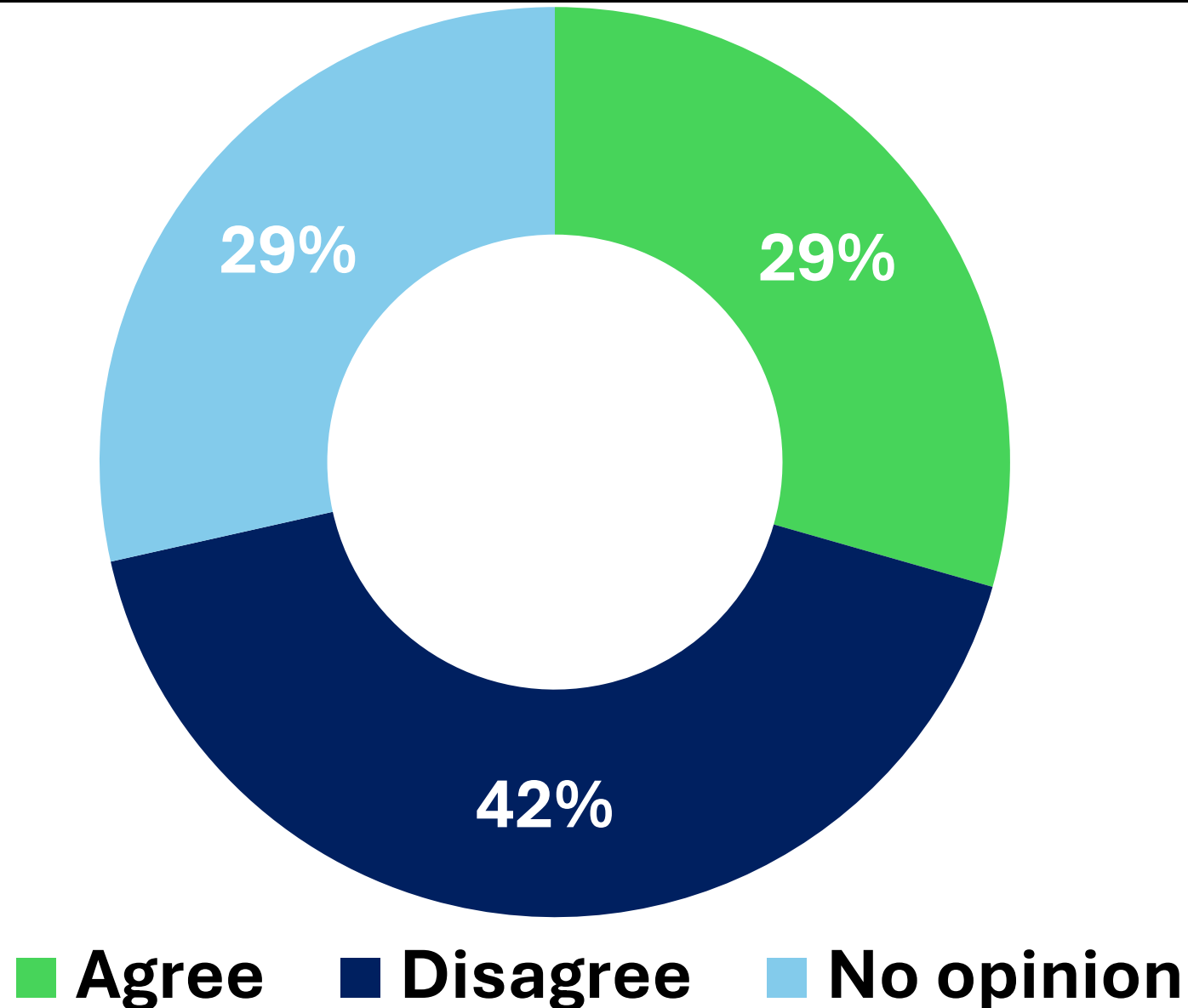
Approval of Regional Tribunals-Education Level

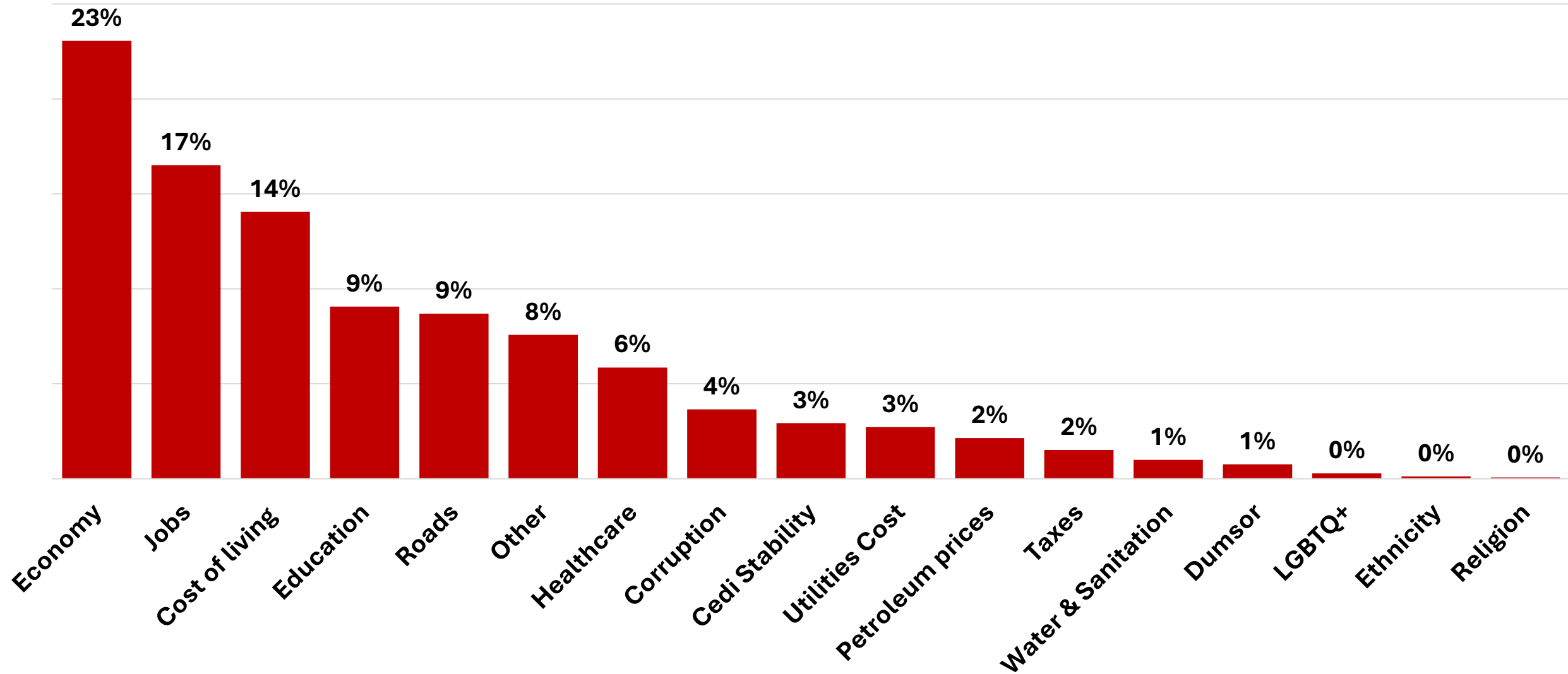

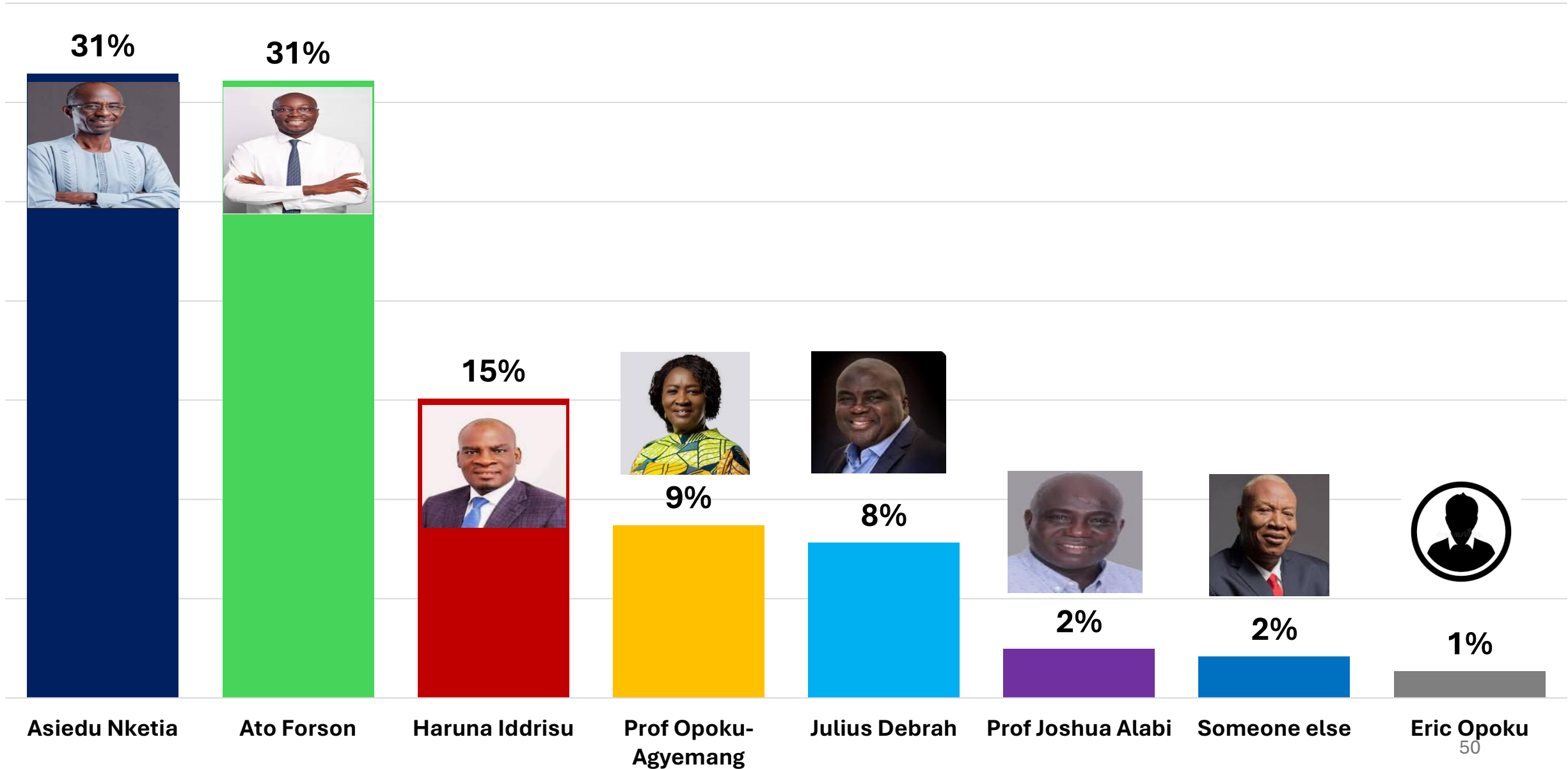

Who leads the NDC in 2028 Election



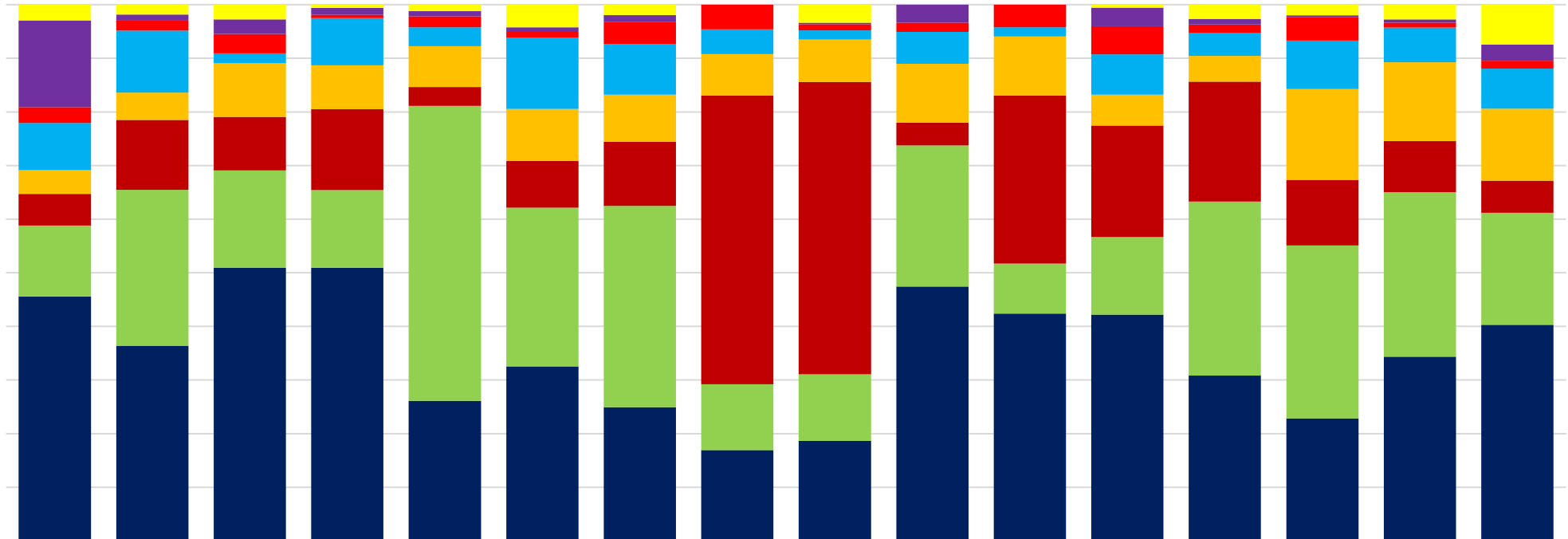

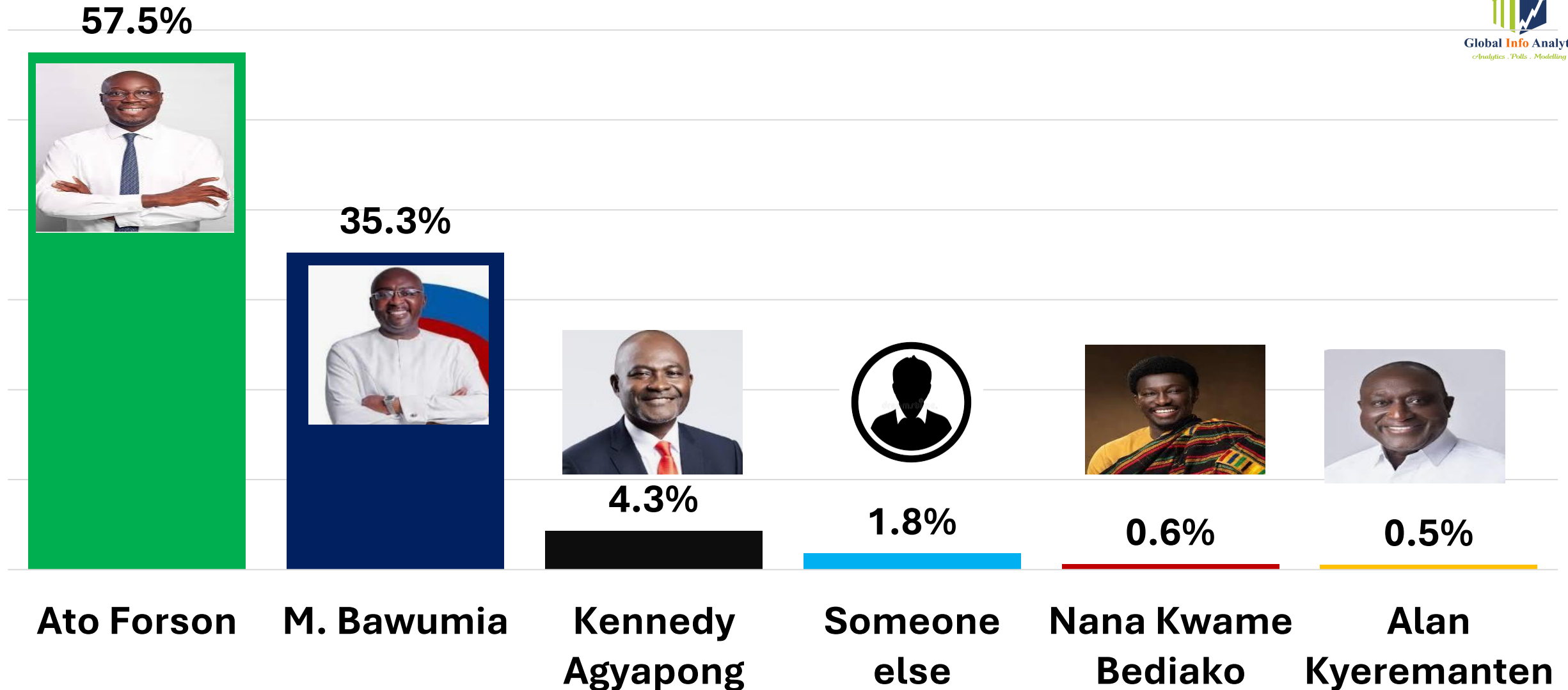

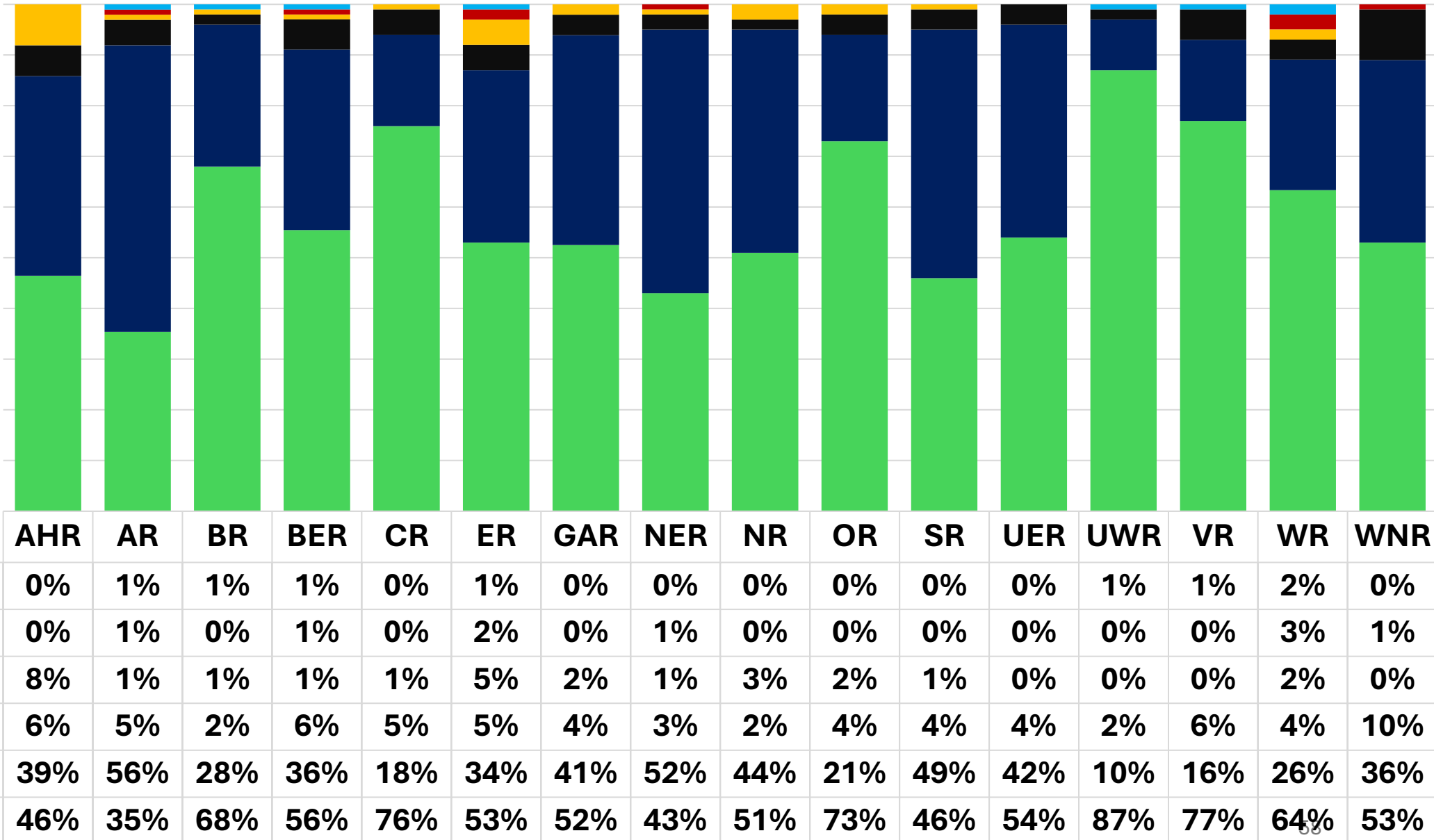

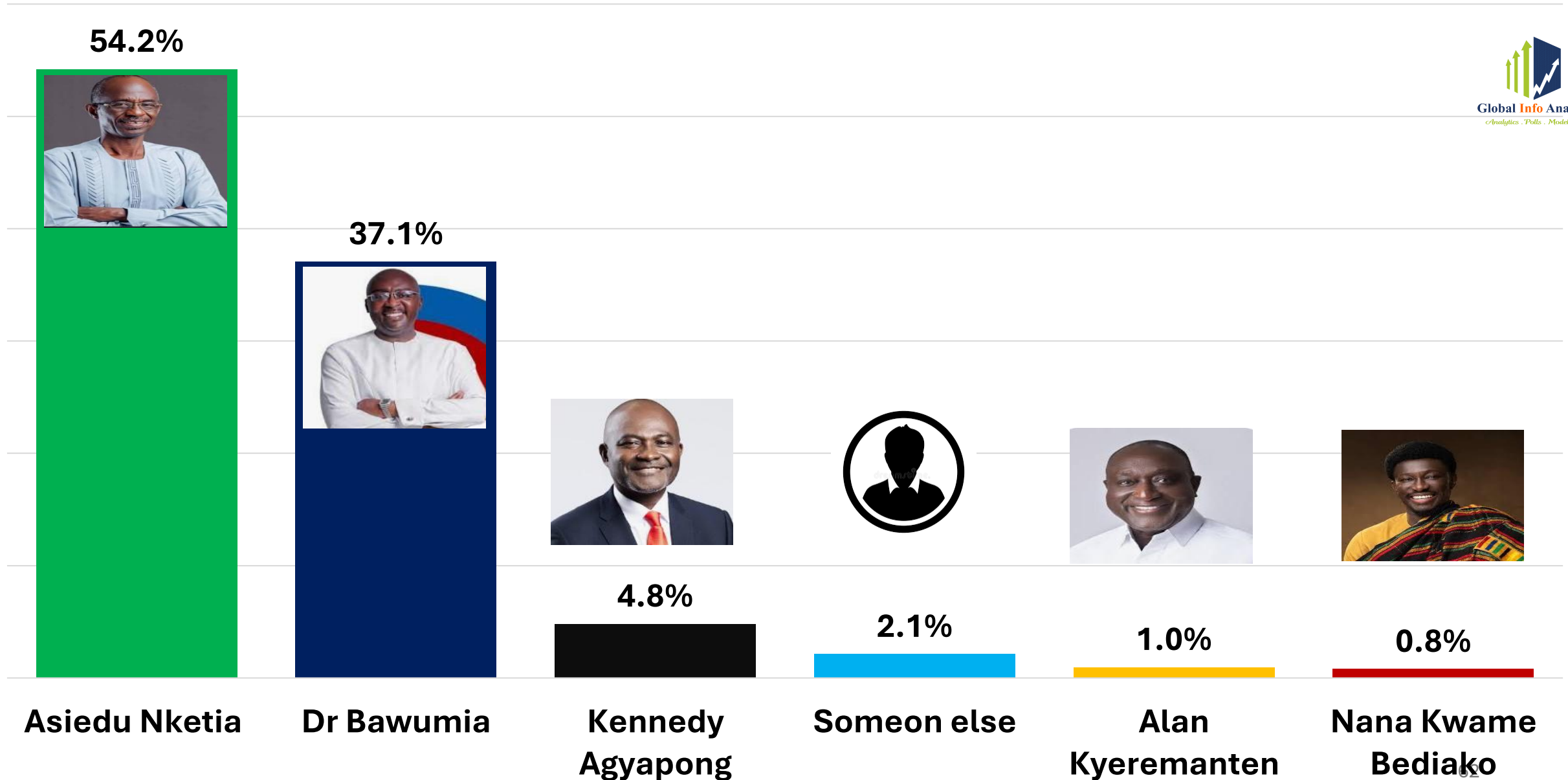

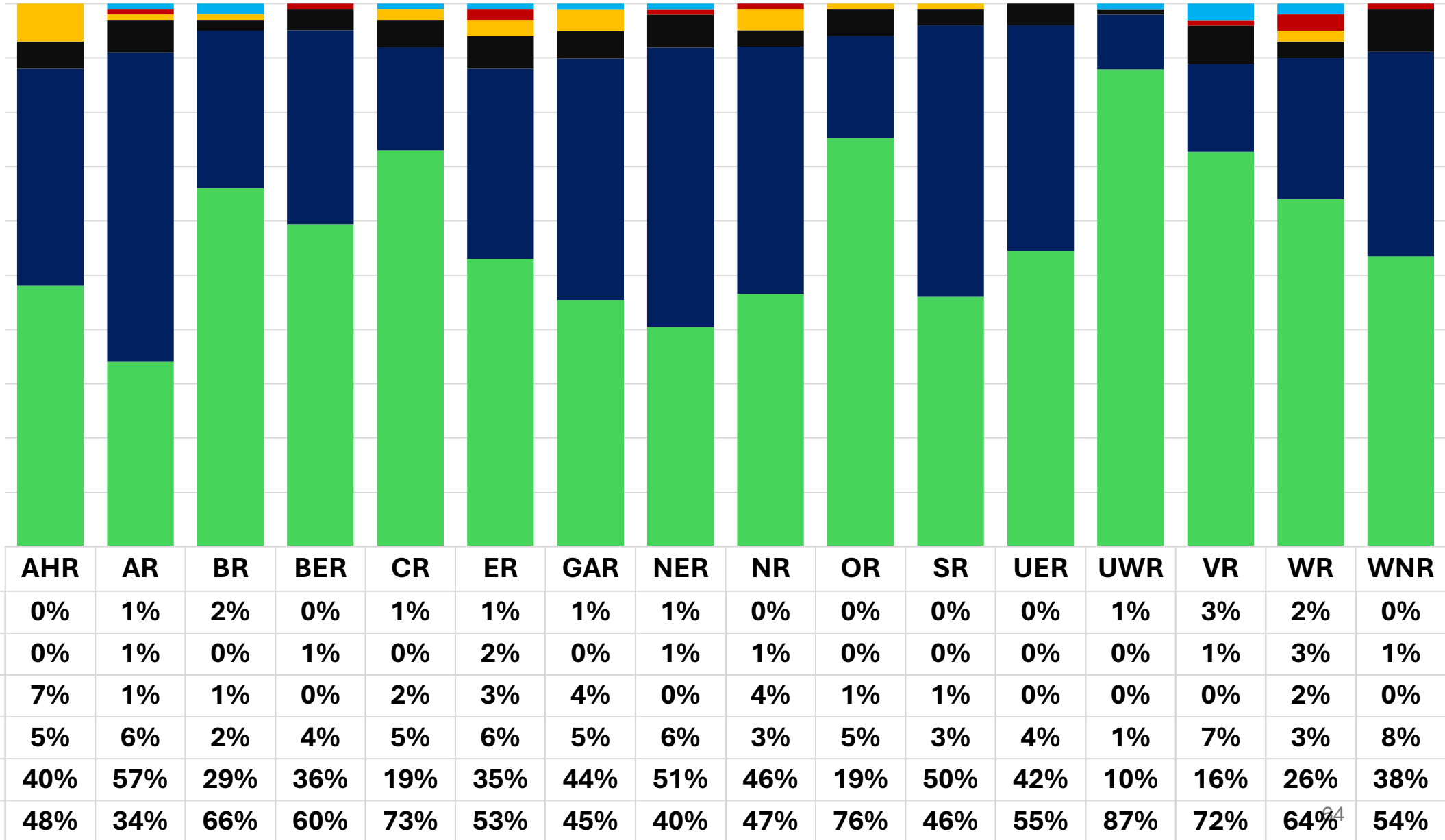
